AL REED PACES PENNSBURY TO 12-6 VICTORY; TURNER RUNS 83 YARDS FOR NESHAMINY TD

A new coaching deal at Pennsbury High School made a successful debut at Langhorne last Friday night when Pennsbury High defeated Neshaminy, 12-6, in the first Lower Bucks County Conference fray of the season.

But the two new coaches, George Jarmoska and Ed Coia, had a rug-ged quarterback to thank in the person of Al Reed. The Falcon passed, punted, ran and quarter-backed his club to the upset vic-

About 1,000 fans were treated to a better than usual opening game despite fog and mist which made night football uncomfort-able. Jack Sands of Yardley scored Pennsbury's winning touchdown in the last quarter on a pass in the end zone from Ray Bray.

Previously, Frank Hunter had tallied for Pennsbury, and Joe Turner bounced back two plays later to run 83 yards, around end for a Neshaminy score.

The opening game loss was a bitter setback to Neshaminy. It marked the first loss by the locals to that club in many years, although the teams waged a scoreless tie last season.

Pennsbury Led In Downs Pennsbury clearly outplayed Neshaminy, registering nine first downs to five for the losers. More important, Pennsbury gave Neshaminy plenty of chances on fumbles and two poorly thrown aerials. Despite these errors, Pennsbury came through to win.

Neshaminy forced its first opportunity in the initial

portunity in the initial quarter when Steve Cloak recovered a fumble on the Neshaminy 43. With Mongillo and Barnett doing most of the lugging, the Redskins went to the 20 and a first down. At that spot three ground attempts went to the 17. On last down, Maurer missed Dorsey with a pass.

Hectic action featured the second quarter. Shortly after it Pennsbury took over, Curley restarted Reed threw a pass from covering. the 43-yard line to Frank Hunter to the 20. Hunter ran the rest of 'he way to score. Sands placement try failed.

Following the TD, Pennsbury kicked off and Neshaminy fooled around with the ball. No return was made and the ball was downed on the 17. On the first play, Turner broke loose around his own right end and sped 83 yards for a Neshaminy tally. Mongillo's placement was wide and the score was tied, 6-6.

Neshaminy's Bob Castle took the third quarter kickoff back 20 yards to the 43 to start the last half. But e plays were stopped,

Peal had to punt to the 35.

At that point Hofmann inter-cepted Bray's pass on the Neshaminy 45. Subsequent stabs at the line lost to the 48, and Peal punted to the 27. Reed made a nice return to the 43.

Here again Neshaminy got another break. Ed Carber found a fumble on the 44. But on the very next play Neshaminy fumbled and

A holding penalty set Penns-bury back to the 25 and Sands los' to the 21. Hunter then rammed his way 12 yards to the 33 on a

straight buck. Sands moved to the 44 and Reed punted to the Neshaminy 29.

Pennsbury Wins Game

Here Pennsbury got a break and they capitalized on it. They re-covered a Neshaminy bobble on the 27. Bray moved to the 24 and Reed found Hunter with a pass to the 15. Then Ray Bray passed to Sands in the zone to win the game, 12-6.

Late in the last quarter Neshaminy hopped on another fumble on the Pennsbury 33. Mongillo broke loose to the 22 and a first-down. Then followed four futile ground attempts with no passes at all. Pennsbury took over on downs.

With four minutes to go, Ne-naminy again had possession. shaminy But they couldn't advance. The game ended with Reed Intercepting a pass on the Pennsbury 43 after he had punted from his own 22 to Neshaminy's 35. (J. G.)
