

Neshaminy High Runs Wild in Second Quarter to Beat Lw. Moreland, 37-0

Taking advantage of several fumbles and playing its best game of the season, Neshaminy High defeated Lower Moreland, 37-0, last Friday night before a small crowd on Playwicki Field.

So domineering was the Langhorne eleven that it was not forced to punt the entire game. After a scoreless first quarter, the locals raked up 25 points in the second quarter, believed to be a new one-quarter record for the school.

In the third quarter Coach Jim Egli sent his second squad out for a period of activity with the exception of quarterback Lou Maurer.

Ray Mongillo scored two Redskin touchdowns. He started the rout by bulling over from the four in the second period. A long run by Bob Castle placed the ball in scoring territory.

Castle sailed 19 yards around his own left end in the same quarter. Maurer scored the extra point when he picked up a fumble on the placement boot try and ran it into the end zone.

The match continued in the second quarter when Don Leitch recovered a fumble on the loser's 22. On the first play Mongillo ran hard and true around his own right end to score standing up. Lex missed the point try.

Two plays after Neshaminy had kicked-off to Lower Moreland, the loser's again fumble. Ed Carber recovered on the 34. Tom DiIorio cracked the line to the 17. Then Ray Brodle went the rest of the

way for the Redskin's fourth touchdown in the second period.

Neshaminy almost had its fifth second quarter tally before the half ended. Ed Hurst recovered Lower Moreland's third fumble on the 10. After two plays failed to net any yardage, Jack Magnire broke loose to the one yard line where he fumbled. Lower Moreland recovered and a nearly-blocked punt went out of bounds on the 12. VanSant ended another threat when he dropped the ball on the five yard stripe.

The third quarter got underway with Neshaminy moving from its 20 to the Lower Moreland four on a sustained drive. At that spot a poor pass from center was recovered by Lower Moreland on the 14. Then the losers put on a passing display which carried them to Neshaminy's 29, their deepest penetration of the game.

Joe O'Brien, however, put an abrupt end to the drive by picking up another Lower Moreland fumble on the 29 and racing 71 yards for another Neshaminy tally. This made it 31-0. Lex again missed his conversion.

Elmer VanSant scored in the fourth period when he found a big hole off-tackle. He scooted 41 yards to score.

Late in the fourth quarter Neshaminy moved to the Lower Moreland 11 as the game ended. A clipping penalty during the drive halted a possible touchdown. Castle, Don Barnett and passes from Maurer to Mongillo featured the advance.
