The formation of three separate bands at the secondary level at Neshaminy has been in the making for the past few years and promises to contribute much to the athletic contests and other school functions.

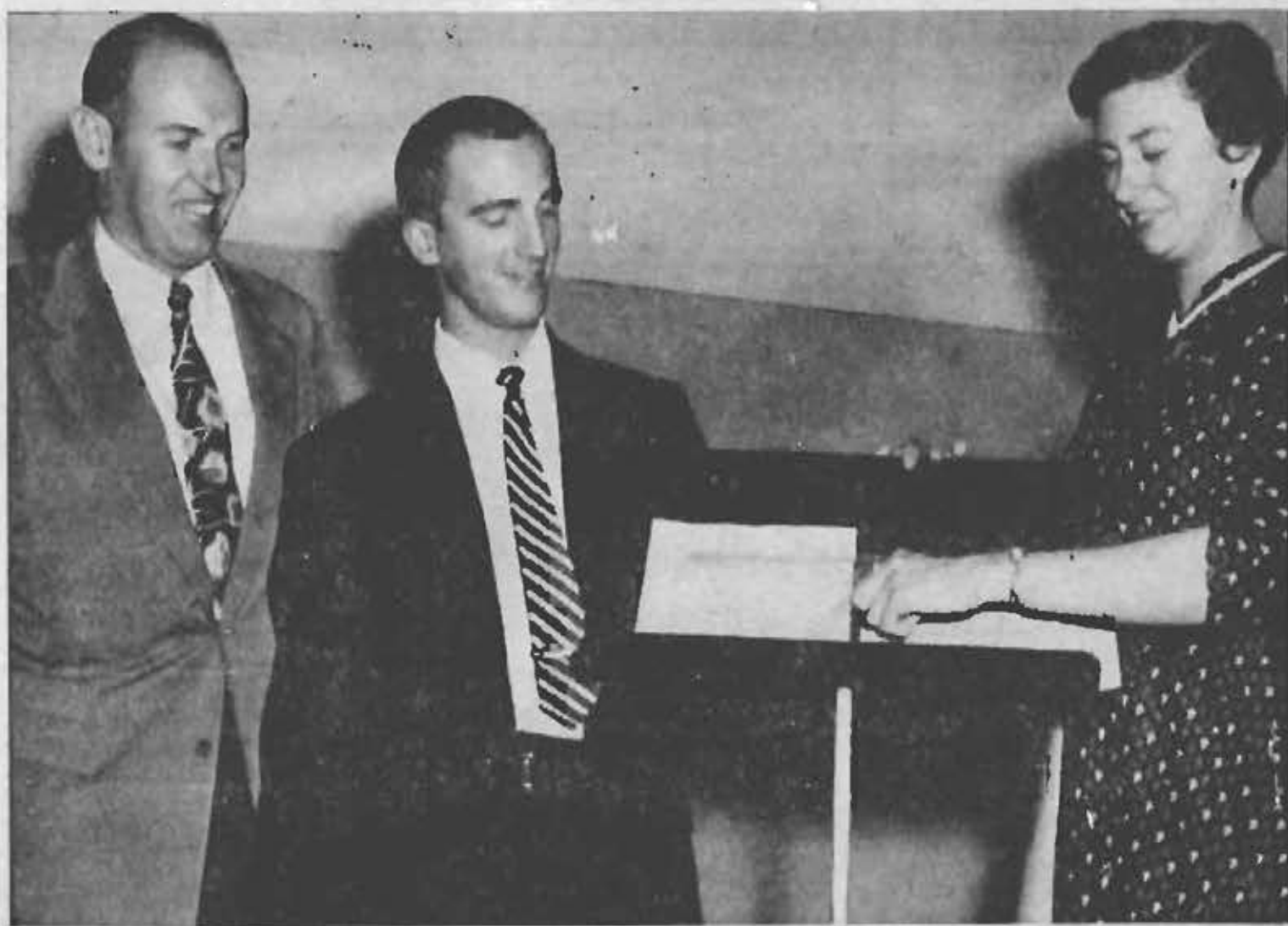
