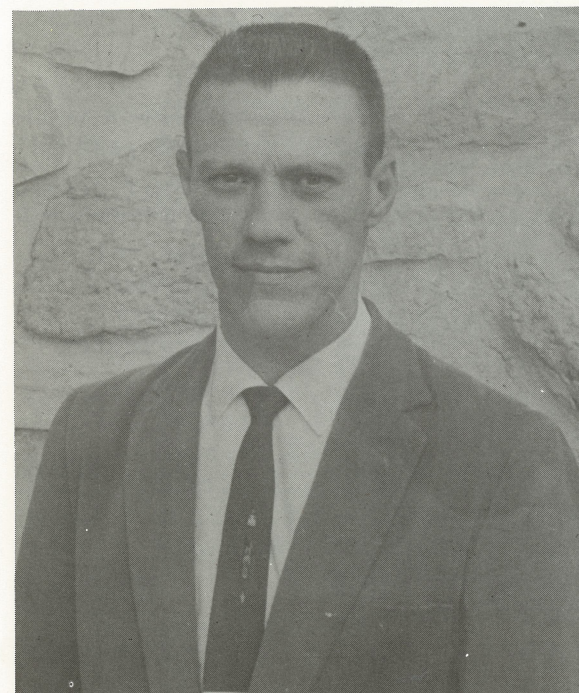

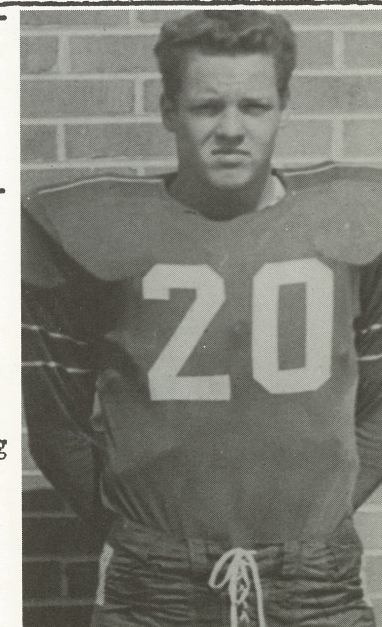


Paris "Pal" Allison

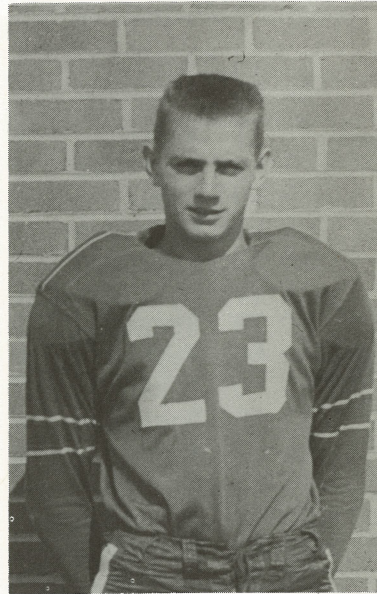


9 - Robert Rumsey

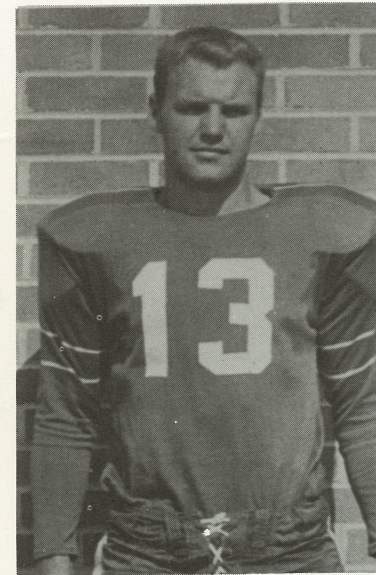
"Bob" has followed in the footsteps of his brother George as an extra point specialist. A good utility player, Bob's speed has been used as a defensive end.

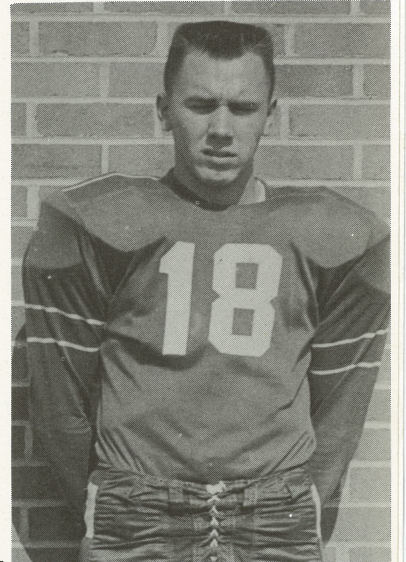


13 - Donald Bockhorn

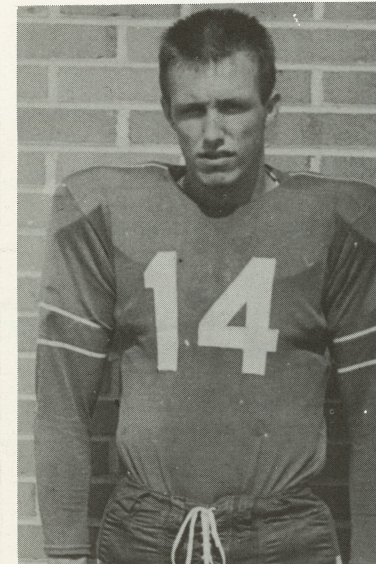


10 - William Watkins

"Bob" has given much time and work for the Neshaminy Redskins over the years and his presence at the games and at the practice sessions will be missed in '60.

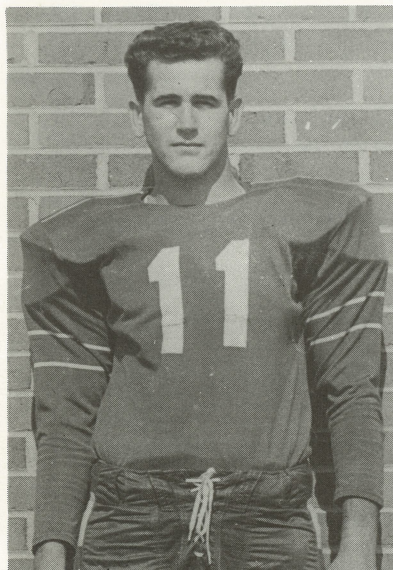
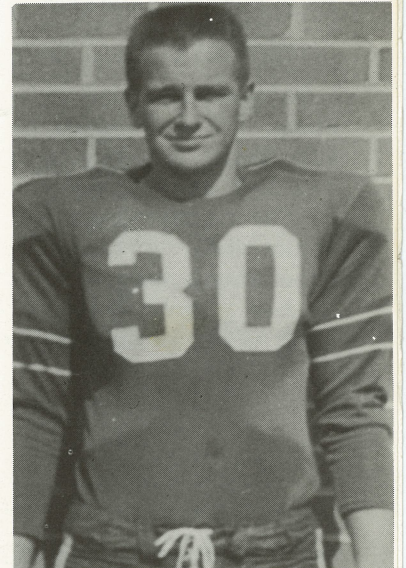


14 - Tom Evans

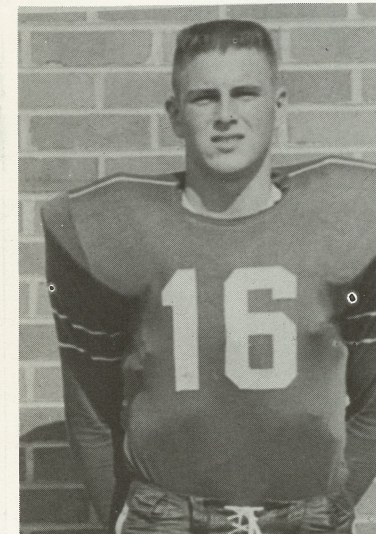


11 - Jerry Lauther

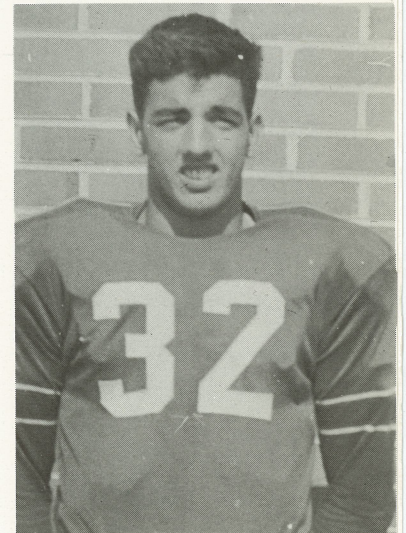


16 - Fred Ermel

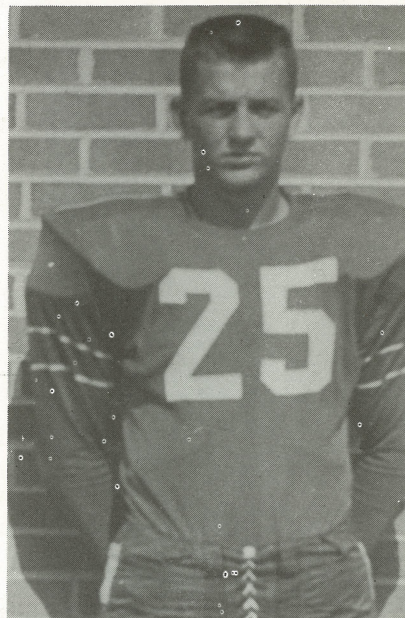


19 - Edward Fiorelli

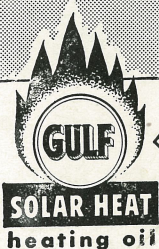
