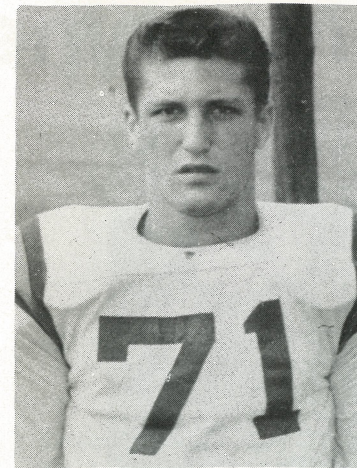

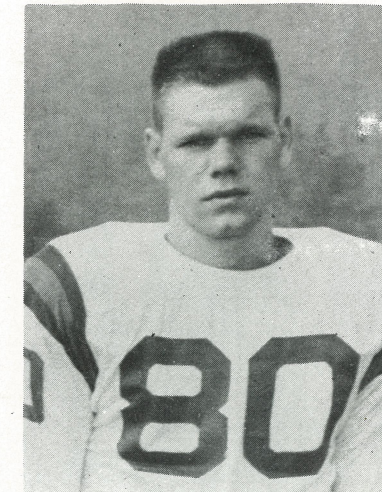

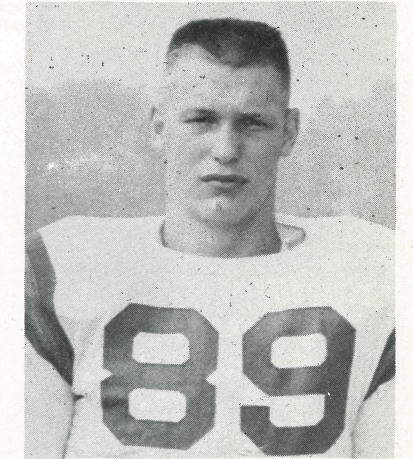
MR. OUTSIDE - Jack Stricker

As The Whistle Blows

the REDSKINS of Neshaminy High open the lid on the 1960 football season. For the first time in nine years the perennial Lower Bucks League Champs will be without the services of Harry E. Franks--the man who changed the meaning of NESHAMINY from a slow-moving creek to a powerful streak of lightning. Franks vacated his job as boss of the REDSKINS to likeable John Petercuskie, whose masterful knowledge of the game is respected by everyone.

WHAT'S AHEAD FOR '60? Seventy-eight boys reported for tryouts--the largest ever here at NESHAMINY--but not in this group were 16 of the toughest REDSKINS to play here over the last three years. Gone are the determined SAVAGES and key backfield men who won the league title each year, beat Allentown 18-0 and lost to Easton by a 13-7 thriller.

Petercuskie and his fine coaching staff have this returning: two of the finest backs in the entire state in Stricker and Schuh; a tough lineman in Currie; a solid group of junior candidates who had seen only limited varsity action; a J.V. team unbeaten by a L. B. eleven; and graduates of both of our Junior Highs--both unbeaten by a L. B. Junior High team last fall.

Bishop Egan is in about the same situation--Coach Bedesem says that when Egan graduated its first senior class last June, 16 football players left with them.

The Eagles will show us a T - running eleven with Joe Tentilucci q-backing the team. Landler and Rotunno represent two more experienced backs while Lyman at end, Marnien at tackle, Roche at center, and Lobos at guard complete the list of experienced personnel.

Three weeks of tough scrimmage have come up with this lineup: Rell and Held at ends; Carber and Bonsall at tackles; Currie and Baker, guards; and Hertz a center. In the backfield Boerckel blocking back, Schuh at full, and half-backs Stricker and Kaminski.

If NESHAMINY'S 1960 line can do just a partial job of blocking you may see Jack skooting off tackle or around the end... you may see Harry charging up the middle or you may watch the quick and accurate arm of Ed Kaminski hit one of his ends.

September is here; Football is here; Neshaminy and Lower Bucks football fans alike are looking toward NESHAMINY to supply them with interesting football.

Will area football fans see NESHAMINY LIGHTNING strike tonight for Petercuskie and a new band of REDSKINS -- or has it disappeared from this field? 'll all find out

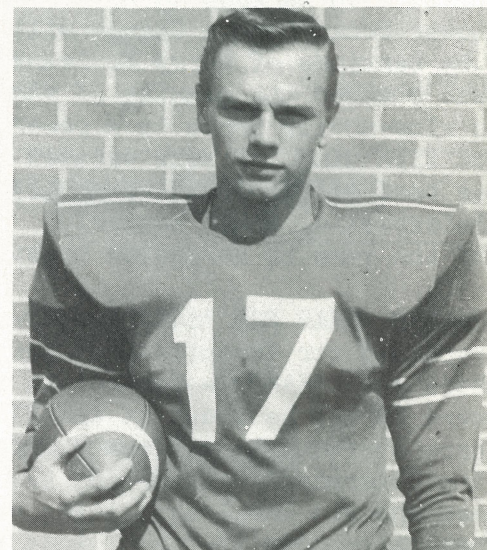
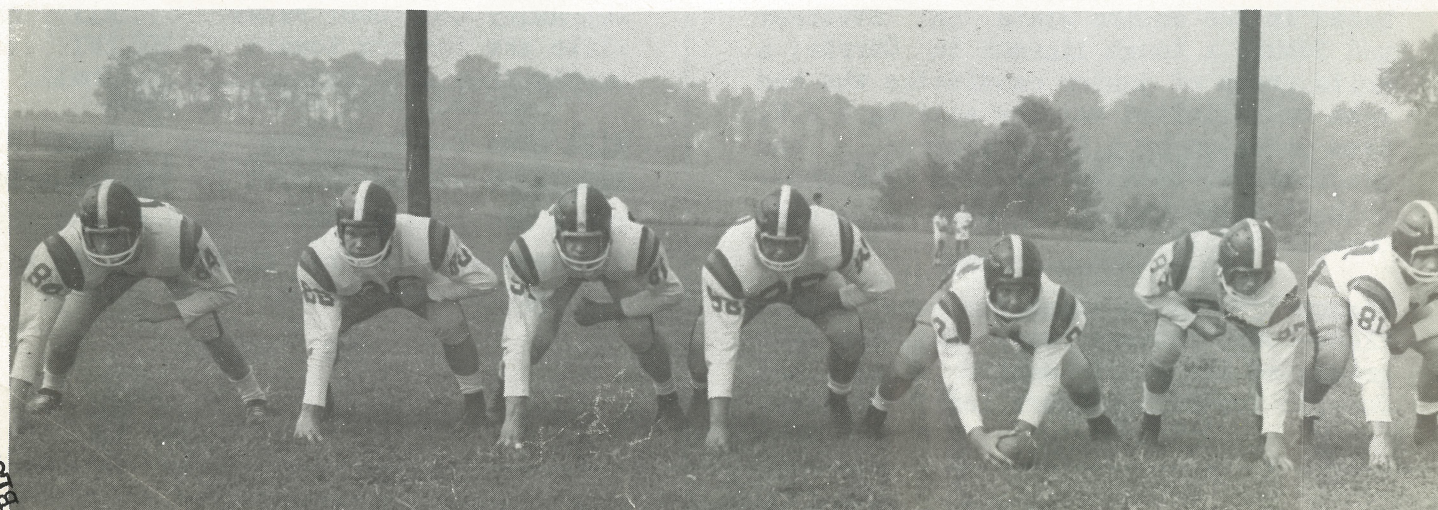

A VETERAN BACKFIELD: The REDSKIN backfield will be centered around the two best backs in this area-- Jack Stricker (Mr. Outside) and Harry Schuh (Mr. Inside.) Jack is 2 inches taller and carries 13 more pounds than in 1959 when he was named on the Lower Bucks All-Star Team. Harry added 25 pounds to his powerful frame and the ALL-PENNSYLVANIA STATE second team back and twice scoring champ in Lower Bucks is anxious to start pounding opposing lines for more scoring honors. Rich Boerckel is expected to be more than adequate for the blocking back assignments while Ed Kaminski will round out the foursome with his excellent passing arm and a fast pair of legs. Franny McCollum will add speed to the backfield when called on this season.

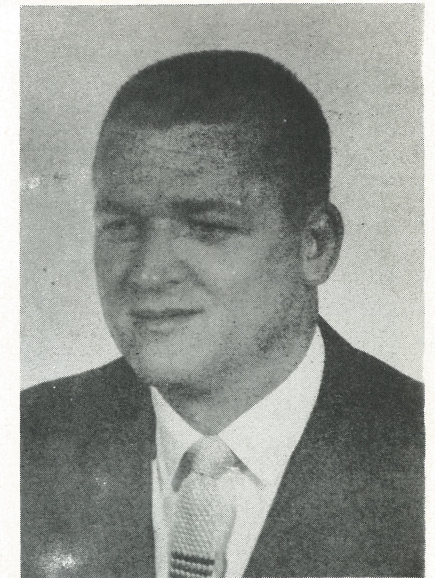

Meet John Petercuskie



Meet John Petercuskie----Meet the new top man of the Neshaminy High School Redskins.

Introducing the new head football coach, John Petercuskie, to Lower Bucks County football fans would be like trying to introduce folks to Neshaminy Football-- for over the past six years our new head mentor worked, planned, and fought side by side with ex-coach Harry E. Franks. Franks, who stepped aside to spend full time as an administrative assistant in the Senior High, won the Lower Bucks League Football Championship each of the eight years he head-coached the Redskins. "Cuskie" became a part of Neshaminy's state-wide drive for football supremacy in the 1954 season and in 1957 was named Co-head Coach of the Redskins.

Our new head coach has not limited himself to football during his half-dozen years at Neshaminy, for Petercuskie was responsible for initiating wrestling, coached varsity baseball for two seasons, and can be seen at almost every athletic contest of any of the Neshaminy teams.

Petercuskie graduated from Old Forge (Pa.) High School after participating in the three major sports: football, as a lineman; basketball, as a center; and baseball, as an infielder. After graduation "Cuskie" attended Scranton Keystone Junior College (Jack Swartz was there, too), and spent one year there. He then attempted to enlist in the Navy--but refused because of age, but later (August, 1943) became United States Marine which claimed 32 months of his life taking him from Paris Island all the way to the Pacific Islands, including Okinawa.

In 1946 "Cuskie" began preparing for the head coaching job he now holds by attending East Stroudsburg State Teachers College (Jack Swartz was there, too). As a starting guard, Petercuskie was selected on the All-State Teachers Eleven each of his four years, was third team All-State his junior year, and a Little All-American mention his senior year. Petercuskie was a catcher on the baseball team his last year.

After graduation "Cuskie" was called back into the Marines for a short stay and in the fall of 1951 returned to his home town, Old Forge, to assist with football as line coach along with coaching varsity basketball and varsity baseball. Old Forge won the Eastern Conference Championship in 1952 after copping the Lackawanna League Football Crown.

John Petercuskie married "the girl next door" in 1950. John and Dorothy Petercuskie first moved to Langhorne, but since the birth of their third son they and their three husky boys have lived in Feasterville. The family includes John, 9, who will attend fifth grade at Lower Southampton; Jerry, 7, who is in second grade at the same school; and Gary, 5, who will be in kindergarten at the Poquessing School.

Petercuskie is a supervisor for the Lower Southampton Recreation program and spends his few idle hours golfing--while he has only spent three years at the game, he takes great pride in winning the 1960 Lower Southampton Golf Championship.

The new head football coach plans no changes for the Neshaminy Football Team in 1960--he still plans to have Neshaminy play championship football.
