HERE COMES JACK

The destructive NESHAMINY REDSKINS take the field to "play" with their good neighbors from Newtown---the Indians of Council Rock. This game may bring to a close football relations with the Newtown School for some time, if the new L. B. league realignment takes place next year.

What is the story this year in the Lower Bucks League? Sure, NESHAMINY has always been the powerhouse--but 1960 has become the year of years, for the REDSKINS. It is the opinion of this writer that the 1960 Skins have become even more powerful than their predecessors while the other teams have all maintained their typical Lower Bucks League status.

Surely the REDSKINS have score 40 and 50 points a game before, but not with their first team sitting on the bench more than one-fourth of the time. The Skins have scored 264 points in its six league games for a 44-points-a-game average. In the meantime, the defensive eleven (which I questioned would ever become SAVAGE) has allowed only one T.D. in its six league contests.

The REDSKINS have not made a change in their offensive unit during the 1960 season, and only the center of the defensive lines have needed re-touching. This is not to say that most of the 33-man squad have not been directly instrumental in writing the '60 records. On the offensive unit Mike Rassier, Ron Young, Bob Bickel, and Ron Carroll have been a big help while Howard Venzie, Dick Lauther, Mike Wunsch, James Gummel, Dick Blodgett, Bob Cummings and Mike Wingfield have all given the defensive unit a rest with an assurance of continued 100% effectiveness.

The REDSKINS should have little difficulty with Council Rock tonight, but will have their toughest battle of the league campaign with the OWLS of Bensalem next Saturday at 2 p.m. Be on hand to see the Skins fight for their ninth championship.....

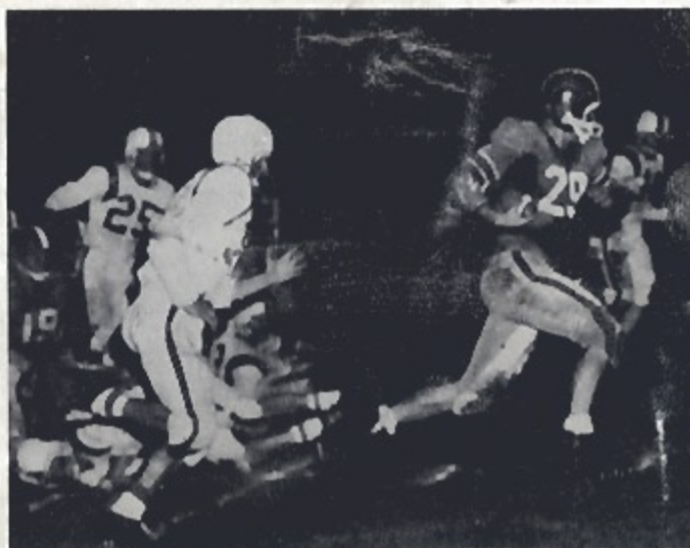

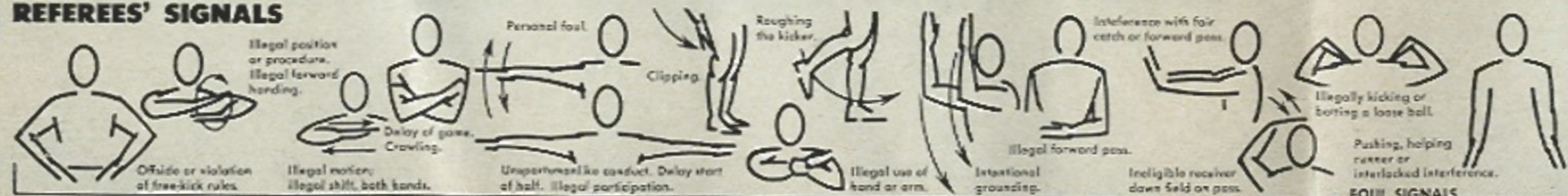
