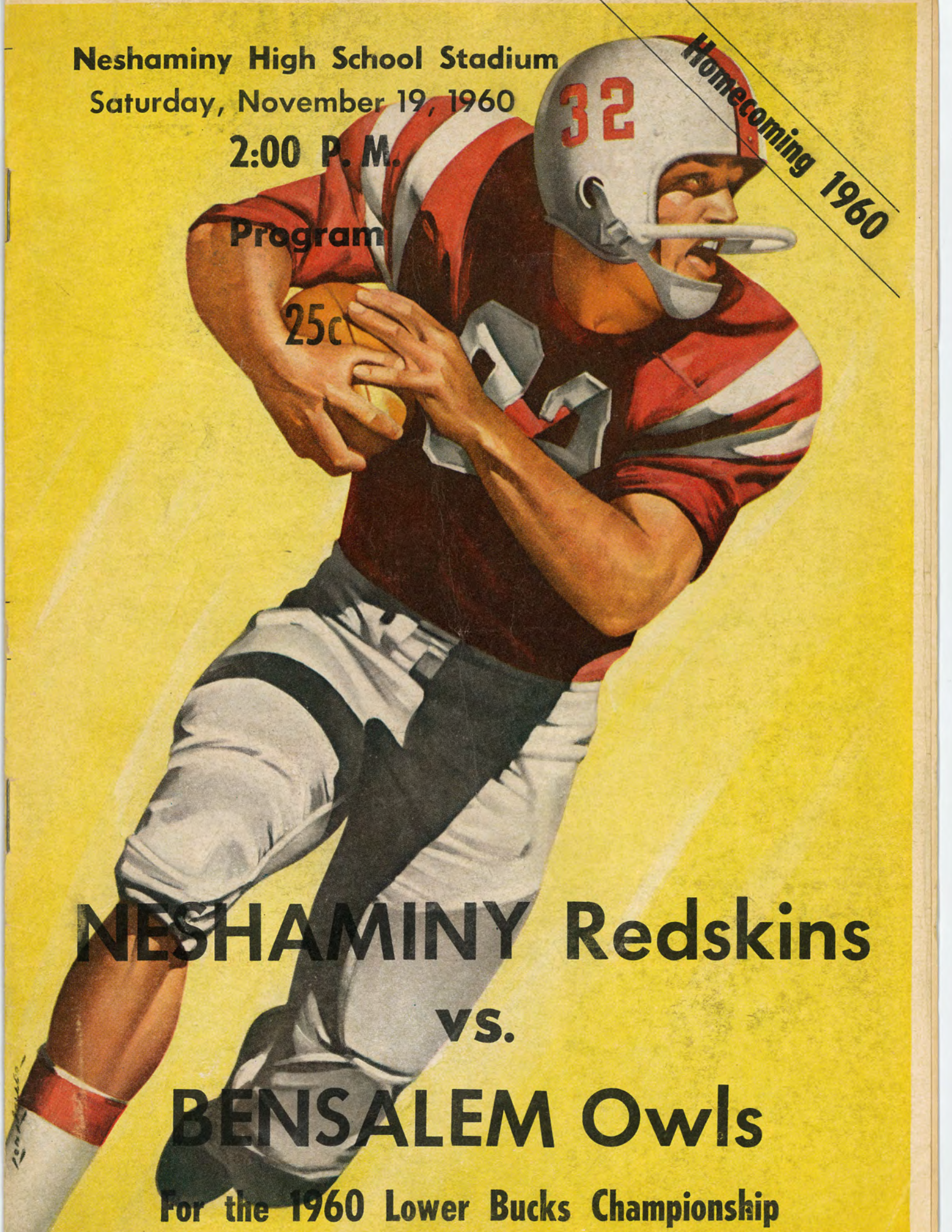

**The 1960 Edition of the Redskins**



As The Whistle Blows

the most powerful band of REDSKINS ever to wear the Neshaminy Red and Blue take the field for their final game of this 1960 season. The Skins who have already rewritten most of the league and district scoring records still have one obstacle in their path before laying claim to their ninth straight Lower Bucks Championship—the OWLS of Bensalem.

As was true in previous years, the REDSKINS must win the Bensalem game if they are to maintain their title as "King of Lower Bucks Football". And just as in previous years, the Bensalem Owls bring into this game the toughest competition to be found in the league. Both the Skins and Owls are undefeated in league matches and both have posted convincing wins over most of the other teams.

With Marlon Van Horn back in command the upset-minded Owls will be out to do a repeat performance of the 1953 fracas in which Bensalem turned back a good Neshaminy eleven 7 to 6.

The 1960 Owls may have the men to do it again in Bob Mudie, quarterback, who can accurately hit his ends or his fullback or for that matter, run the ball from the T or the single-wing type offense installed recently.

The Skins will show its homecoming alumni and friends a rough and tough ground game which has already netted them 404 points this season. They do not own a passing arm such as that of Maurer, Kauffman, Faunce, or Gaskill nor do they have a Don Cameron, Cloak, Covington, Ahlum, Conroy or any of the other too-numerous to mention earlier Langhorne-Middletown football standouts; but the Redskins of 1960 do have a powerful machine which has been built to do only two things—score touchdowns and prevent other teams from gaining any ground.

The 1960 Redskins have a damaging front wall backed up by two runners, the likes of which local sport fans will not see for a long time. Jack Stricker and Harry Schuh have made area sport fans look more than twice as they take their turns in carrying the ball for another record score. In addition to Harry and Jack, eleven top-flight seniors will be wearing the Red and Blue for the last time—Jack Currie (a three-year lineman), Rich Boerckel, Franny McCollum, Jerry Hertz, Ron Young, Ron Carroll, James Gummel, Howard Venzie, John Buhner, Charles Kemp and David Richardson.

These thirteen boys will be notably missed come next football season but it is our wish that we can remember them for giving Neshaminy its ninth consecutive Lower Bucks Championship. We will find this out.....

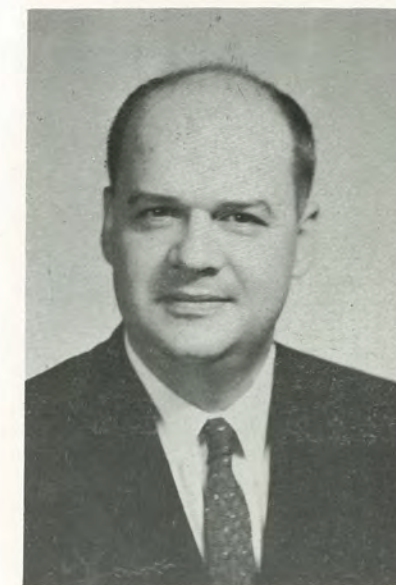
## GREETINGS FROM NESHAMINY

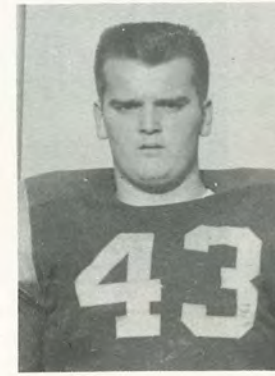
