



AS THE WHISTLE BLOWS

the Redskins of Neshaminy face up to the Little Explorers of Philadelphia's LaSalle High School in another clash of champions. Neshaminy, riding high on the crest of another 7-game win streak, would like just one more game in which it could give its much-decorated Redskins a full-scale battle before turning in their uniforms.

From all reports the feeling is mutual for Coach "Tex" Flannery's Little Explorers, for in scanning their credentials it appears that LaSalle is not going into this "state-wide" attraction without its eyes wide open. With little time to gather the particulars, here is what we discovered about last year's City Champs.

One, they are at present in a two-way tie for the Catholic league crown; two, they were last year's City Champs in Philadelphia after turning back the Public League Champ, Frankford, three, LaSalle has won the Catholic League title five out of the last seven years; and four, they have lost only twice and tied once during the last three years—a record equally matched by our own Redskins.


The Little Explorers have done this with a sound offensive unit built solidly on the Army lonesome end (RE - 37 - James Detweiller) system, led by a good runner and capable passer in Quarterback Francis Daniel (25) and an outstanding fullback in Edward Brennan (42). Add to this a highly-regarded forward wall sparked by Right Guard Donald Fanelle (40) and Right Tackle Louis Galzerano (53) which becomes a stubborn defensive line on the turnabout.

The Redskins will have their single-wing offensive machine in high gear tonight even though they lost their second left halfback last week when sophomore Bill Brundzo suffered a broken hand. Neshaminy's formidable line of Mike Wunsch, Brian Baker, Bob Cummings, Dick Bonsall, John Carber, Bob Bickel and Allan Rell is in good physical condition to lead the attack for Tom Preno, Bob Barr, Bruce Evans, and Bob Baxter. Once again the defensive "Savages" will be tested for its ability to keep the opposition intact during its half of the game.

It is interesting to note that LaSalle has been playing its games with the two-point extrapoint option as do the colleges and what procedure will be accepted for tonight's game will be announced before game time.

The Neshaminy-LaSalle contest tonight marks the final home appearance for the 1961 season and to the eighteen seniors, who will graduate come next June, a special thank you is in order -- see the next page. These eighteen seniors will be notably missed come next football season, but it is our wish that we can remember them for more than the usual Lower Bucks Championships' a win tonight would be worth lots more. It's in your hands.....






John Carber Tackle



"Thanks, Seniors, for a Job Well Done"



Next Thursday morning, eighteen seniors will wind up their high school football careers when the Redskins visit the Bensalem Owls in a final return to the traditional Thanksgiving game. Tonight will mark the final home appearance for these 18

veteran footballers as the Redskins face up to LaSalle, and followers of Neshaminy High School football are unanimous in saying "Thanks. Seniors, for a job well done."

When these boys entered the senior high school back in September 1959, Neshaminy had recorded seven consecutive championship seasons and followers of the Skins wondered how long this could continue. Not only have these boys continued the fine record set by previous Redskin 11's, but their teams were instrumental in setting even greater achievements to guide future Neshaminy elevens.

During the three years these boys played, they were defeated by only one team (Easton High beat Neshaminy 13-7 in 1959 and again this past season) and in their senior high years never lost to, or were tied by, a Lower Bucks school. In adding three more undisputed Lower Bucks titles, the teams these 18 footballers represented chalked up 16 shutouts in posting a 29 wins, 2 losses, and one tie ledger.

The 1959 team set new offensive records in the league which lasted for only one year until the indestructible '60 team established new league, county, and district scoring marks with 476 points.

Perhaps the most interesting achievement of this team is that these boys proved a fact Coach Petercuskie has been claiming ever since his own high school days at Old Forge, which is, "It's what's up front that counts!"

The 1961 team proved that Schuh and Stricker, or any other backs, did not make the team, but the team -- and particularly the line -- made Schuh and Stricker. This year with all new backs, including two sophomores, the Skins scored just as easily with a line the likes of Carber, Bonsall, Baker, Cummings, Rell and company leading the charge.

A look at these 18 seniors shows that the Redskins in 1962 will be without the services of two ends., five tackles, three guards, six backs, one center, and a kicker, the likes of which Lower Bucks football has not seen for many a year.

Allan Rell, a 3-year standout, is easily ranked as the area's outstanding end for his skill in catching passes is equalled by his offensive blocking and defensive quickness. Mike Wunsch has done a satisfactory job at the other end.

Five bruising tackles, making up more than a half ton of brute force, will be saying goodbye this season in the uniforms of John Carber, Richard Bonsall, Richard Blodgett, John Sauers, and Stan Canter. On offense, Carber and Bonsall have been side by side for two full years and get much of the credit for the Skin's offensive effectiveness. Both John and Dick continue on the defense along with Dick Blodgett, John Sauers, and Stan Canter and these boys have been responsible for halting the advance of their opponents.

There is little question that Big John Carber ranks as the most effective lineman to play for the Redskins and should be the recipient of many local, district, and state honors.

A trio of aggressive guards -- Brian Baker, Robert Bickel, and David Carroll-will be lost by graduation. Brian has been worth his weight (143) in gold to Petercuskie's line, both offensively and in key defensive assignments. Bickel and Carroll have shared the starting right guard berth during this season

The six backs departing via the diploma route -- Ed Kaminski, Bruce Evans, Mike Wingfield, Douglas Lanes, James Ball and Don Colbert -- have all lived in the shadows of former and present backfield stars but rose to the occasion whenever called upon. Ed Kaminski showed only a sampling of what could have been done had his services been in use for three years; Bruce Evans has made his mark as a good, tough back adaptable at either halfback or fullback; and Mike Wingfield rendered outstanding service to the defensive "Savages" for the last two years.

Jack Bodziak, a good reserve center, will be lost to next year's team as will the kicking of William Schemberg. Bill's tremendous kickoffs of fifty-five-plus yards have aided Neshaminy greatly in keeping the opponents deep in their own territory.

Former Neshaminy football teams and players have set a high standard for these boys to work and play by, and in turn these 18 seniors will leave an even greater record for others to follow. One can say no more than, "Seniors, you have done your job well, there the honor lies!"
