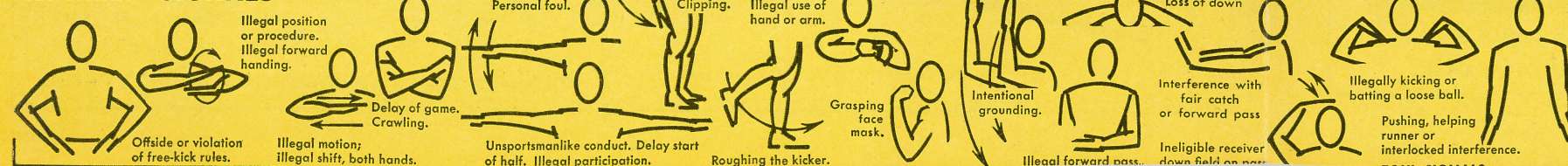


Probable Starting Line-Up — Offense
