





REDSKINS IN 1962

THE NESHAMINY VARSITY REDSKIN LINE STORY

Bob Cummings, center, is what remains after the REDSKINS graduate their most destructive offensive line over the past ten years. With two years of experience and a solid frame of 190 pounds, Cummings will make a good beginning for the 1962 line.

This past year allowed the coaches to utilize a goodly number of young linemen and the situation is not nearly as dark as one may think. Seven good reasons might be Richard Lauther, Ralph Basch, Bruce Galvin, John Reeves, Edward Michaels, Tom Percetti and Milt Rassier. Add to this list Keenan Mucklow, Richard Andrews, and possible defensive stalwarts John Wichelman and Bob Andrassy, and a handful of JV standouts, and another handful of very good Junior High prospects and well, it all adds up to more than four hand fulls; but Petercuskie will be contented to make up only 2 effective lines: 1 - a solid offensive wall for his highly-tutored backs and 2 - a "Savage" defensive unit to stop the likes of Easton, William Allen, Louis Dieruff, etc.





THE NESHAMINY JUNIOR VARSITY STORY

The Neshaminy Junior Varsity represents those boys—usually sophomores—who were not impressive enough to earn a varsity uniform but who could benefit from additional teaching of the basic fundamentals of the game. This team does not consist of rejects, for those boys are cut before school games even begin.

The Junior Varsity games which are played on the Monday afternoon following the varsity contests consist of the regular junior varsity boys and any varsity sophomore and junior boys who did not see considerable action in the varsity game.

This year's JV team does offer some hope for help at the perennial weak spot of the Redskins--the end position. Steve Weinstein, John McCarty, and Bill Swartz may add some strength to the end position while Keenan Mucklow, Jim Frutchie and

Mellis have shown definite promise for 1962 varsity uniforms.

The Varsity Redskin squad is not made up of boys who made the varsity on the first try-to the contrary. A look at the 1959 JV squad (two years ago) includes names like Bruce Evans, Dave Carroll, Dick Blodgett, Bill Schemberg, Jack Bodziak and Doug Lanes. The 1961 Redskins would not be sporting such an enviable record if these boys and others had not "stuck it out" through the lean years.

were Champs three consecutive years during the days of Currie, Schuh, Stricker, Boerckel and company and in two other seasons lost but one game per year.


