

# Play to Begin in 1963

# EASTERN CENTRAL INTERSCHOLASTIC FOOTBALL CONFERENCE

A six team football conference was formed after a year of study and discussion. The conference adopted a constitution and by-laws

The teams which have signed to participate in the newlyformed conference represent the high schools from William Allen, Dieruff, Bethlehem, Easton, Phillipsburg and Nesh-

Thirty-three representatives of 9 high schools met on February 25, 1961, to discuss the possible formation of a football conference. Schools represented were Allen, Dieruff, Bethlehem, Easton, Neshaminy, Pennsbury, Phillipsburg, Scranton Tech and West Scranton. Scranton Central was unable to attend the session but declared interest in such a formation. Three other coal region teams have shown interest. They are Tamaqua, Pottsville and Mahonoy Area Joint.

Among the proposals was the fact that the league should have no tight alignment and that it should start with the 1963 season. Discussion highlighted the possibility of the creation of a conference rather than a league. A league would require meeting all members, while a conference would set up a minimum number of games for consideration for a championship. Each member of the conference will be required to play at least five other teams in the conference in one season and there will be no play-offs.

It will be impossible for all teams in the circuit to participate fully before the 1963 season. Most teams have completed schedules for 1962 and some are committed for dates beyond that. Old rivalries of the various member teams must be considered and schedule adjustments may take a number

of years. The present six teams that make up the conference have been scheduling games with one another, preparatory to the 1962 season. The first championship play will be in 1963. A conference trophy will be presented at the end of each football season thereafter.

League officials have announced that "the door has not been closed" to other members. In fact, it is expected that within another year, the three Scranton high schools—Tech, Central and West—will join the conference, along with Pennsbury.

Elected as first president of the conference was Clifford S. Bartholomew, principal of Allen. Charles Wanamaker, principal at Phillipsburg will serve as vice-president, and Benjamin Everitt, athletic director at Easton, will be secretary-treasurer.

The Easton Area Joint School Committee approved participation by the Easton Area High School in the new grid conference. The Phillipsburg Board of Education voted unanimously to allow the Phillipsburg High School football team to play in the newly formed Eastern Central Interscholastic Football Conference.

Easton or Wm. Allen will not benefit by the make-up of the new conference, as each school already meets the 5 other schools joining the new alignment. In 1962 Bethlehem, picks up Neshaminy and Phillipsburg meets Scranton Tech (although Tech is not a member this year). In 1963, Neshaminy will play Dieruff and also take on Phillipsburg for the first time on October 25 at Phillipsburg.


