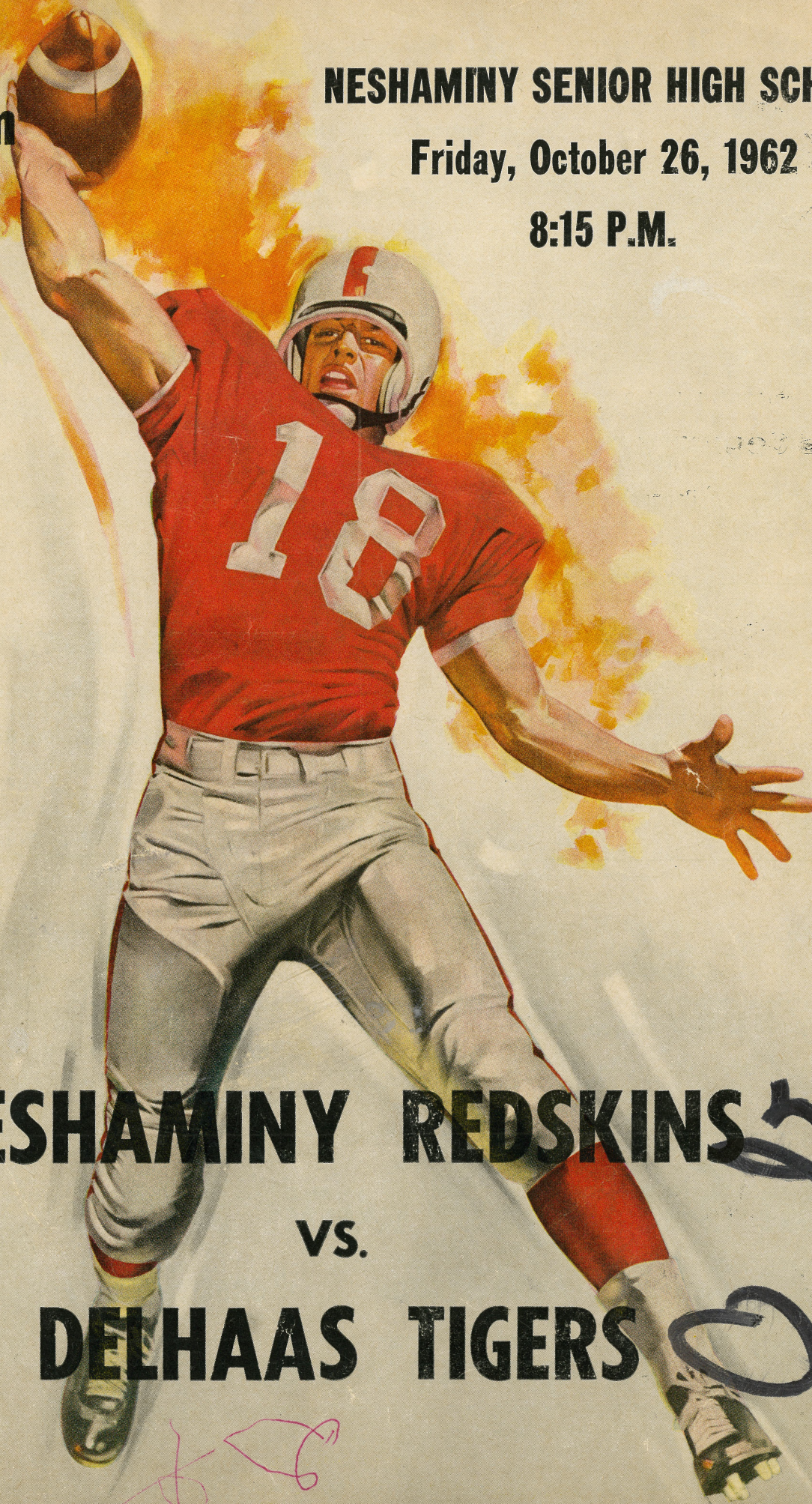

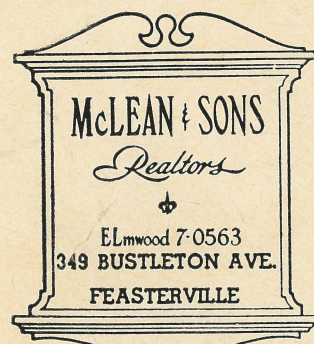

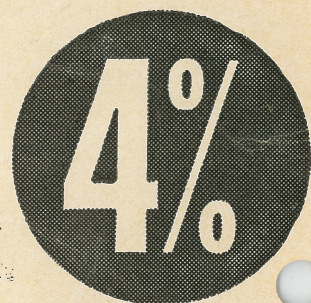

As The Whistle Blows!

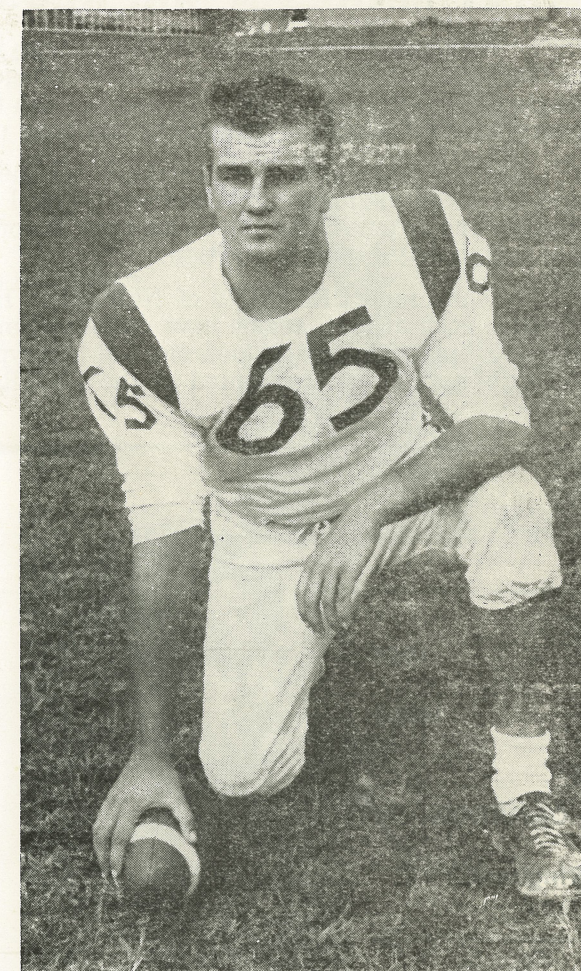
the REDSKINS come back home to write the final page in their short ten-year history of football games with the Tigers of Delhaas. This last game with the Tigers does have a first to it—the introduction of 1954 Delhaas graduate Ken Alston to Lower Bucks County football coaching. Alston, a 1958 West Chester grad is making every attempt to improve on the 2 wins and 7 loss record he inherited from the 1961 squad but it appears that the dozen or more holdovers from last year's team will be fortunate if they can match their record of a year ago.

So far this season the Tigers have one win beating Bristol 43-6 and do not pose any threat of winning tonight's contest with the Redskins. Woodrow Wilson, Morrisville, and Pennsbury will close out the remainder of the Tigers' 1962 schedule and only the winless Bulldogs offer Delhaas its opportunity for a second win. Delhaas has shown definite improvements under Alston for in each of its four losses a break could have turned the tide of victory to the Tigers.

Here is what the Redskins have been up to the past three weeks. At Bethlehem they began as usual going ahead 14-0, then had to start the fourth quarter deadlocked at 14-14; but the Skins got going again to squelch the Red Hurricanes 34-14. Neshaminy did lose the services of John Reeves for the season when he dislocated his elbow in the up-state contest.

The last two weeks saw the REDSKINS return to their happy hunting grounds, the Lower Bucks League, with wins of 54-6 over the Rams and 51-26 over the Falcons last Saturday. Neshaminy's eleven year complete domination of the Lower Bucks Schools is being recognized again tonight with the termination of football with Delhaas. In 1960 the Redskins dropped—or could not schedule—Morrisville and Council Rock, last year Bristol was counted out and tonight the Tigers make number four. It is difficult to say whether the Redskins are dropping the weaker Lower Bucks rivals or whether the rivals are dropping Neshaminy. The Section 2 teams seem to be happy to stay in their own back yard and the time may come when the Redskins may find out that they never had it so good.

Next week the Redskins play their second day game of the season at William Tennent, then come home to face a good Bishop Kenrick team from Norristown and close out the season with the Owls of Bensalem on November 16. The Redskins of 1962 have been just marvelous. While they have allowed more than the usual amount of scores—78 points, they have maintained a 37 plus points a game average in scoring 260 points while posting their six wins and one tie. A

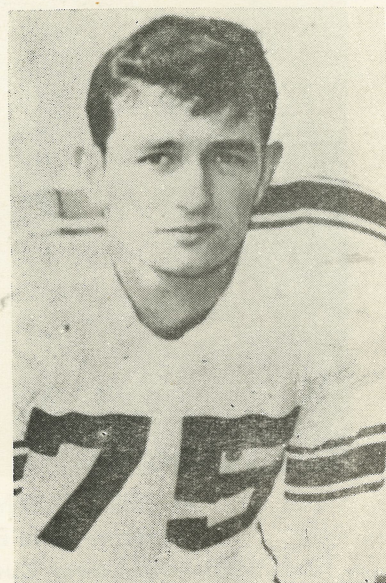
WHAT MAKES A MR. REDSKIN?

The 1962 Neshaminy Redskins



The Redskins will be taking the field for the eighth time this season tonight and within another three short weeks the 1962 season will be history. Looking back over the past seven games one can come to two obvious conclusions: 1—the proud Redskins of 1962 are still “a team apart” from the typical Lower Bucks County brand of football, and 2—the determined Redskins of 1962 **have become** a highly-respected part of the Eastern Pennsylvania Football Conference. The latter point has been accomplished in only three short years under the combined coaching of John Petercuskie, Jack Swartz and Pete Cordelli. These three able men have taken the ten-time Lower Bucks County Champions right to the top level of state football supremacy without faltering one little step along the way. Next year the Redskins will be fulltime members of the newly-organized Eastern Pennsylvania Football Conference and scores of the past few games with these teams indicate Neshaminy can and will meet the challenge of the Lehigh Valley area’s finest football schools.

One of the major reasons for the continued successes of the Neshaminy Redskins is that par-

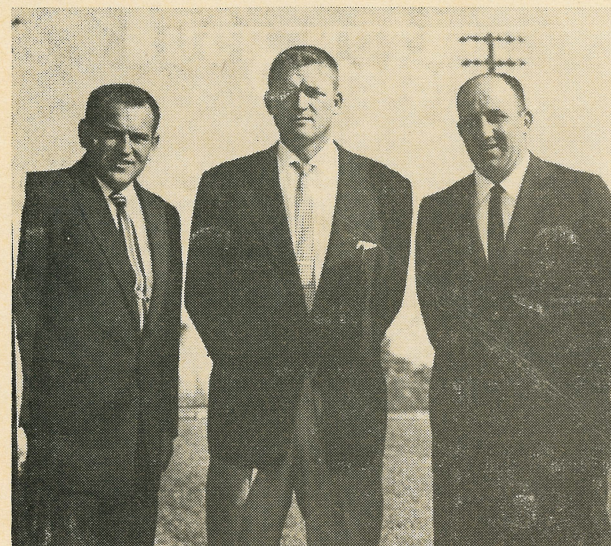
ticipating in Lower Bucks County football has afforded the reserves to see ample action in the varsity games. Varsity experience is an important factor and Coach Petercuskie has been able to give the underclassmen plenty of it in the past, so much so that his teams could graduate 22 men each year and start out the next season with a “well-seasoned” football team. This will not be the case when he goes fulltime with the likes of Easton, Allentown, and Bethlehem.

For instance, let’s look at the three games mentioned above and pick out of the full-game participants the boys returning for next season. Easton: tackle Jenkins and kicker Tragemann are the only linemen. Allentown: tackle Jenkins and kicker Tragemann are the only linemen. Bethlehem: tackle Jenkins, center Mucklow and kicker Tragemann are the only linemen. The backfield does not pose too much of a problem.

When the Redskins go into big time football with their both feet, the problem of “bringing the boys along” will pose a major problem for only three varsity coaches. Neshaminy is ready in 1962, can they continue to be ready in 1963-1964-1965?

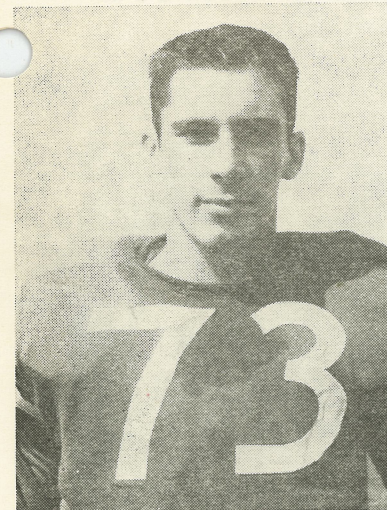

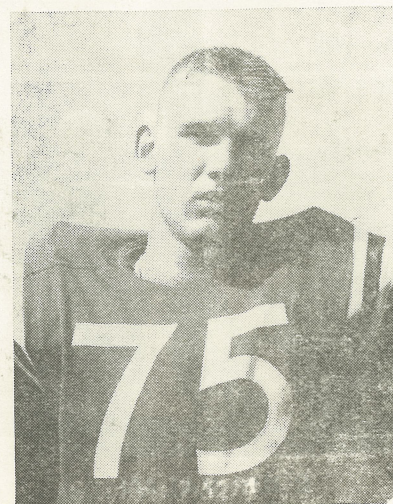
NESHAMINY'S FIVE-MAN BACKFIELD

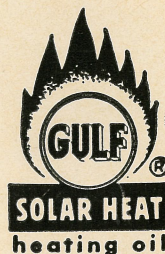

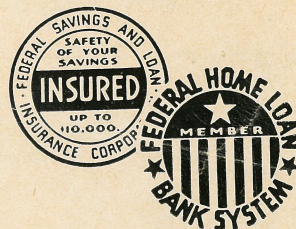
