back to an underthrown football. The 26-yard gainer took the ball to the North three-yard line.

Neshaminy's Frank DiSandro went the final three yards on the next play to stake the South to a 7-0 lead. DiSandro's lumbering nine-foot run up the gut must have appeared to be the tortoise of touchdowns compared to South's next two hare-raising strikes.

Davis, who led all ball carriers with 99 yards on nine carries, extended the South's advantage when he blazed a vapor trail down the sideline. The one-play, 69-yard drive followed a fumble which thwarted an impressive North march.

"Davis we were concerned about prior to the ballgame," said Ort-

man. "Sooner or later . . . Once he breaks the line of scrimmage, we had angles and it didn't make any difference, he was in the end zone. We didn't have anybody who could run with him."

Unfortunately for Ortman, with the South clinging to a 13-7 lead late in the third, he didn't have anybody who could tackle Dunner.

Despite just five offensive plays and zero first downs in the third quarter, the South extended its lead to 19-7 when Dunner returned a punt through the heart of the North coverage for a 66-yard score.

"The punt return was a back-breaker," said Ortman, whose team got on the board earlier in the quarter when Boyle closed out an 11-play drive with a five-yard run.

**Notes:** Despite the loss the North still leads the series 16-8 3 . . . Potter, a First Team All-State defensive back, played three series at quarterback, completing two passes for 34 yards while running for 16 more . . . Wood quarterback Mike Becker completed one pass for 10 yards . . .

Ryan Rupprecht (Wood) and Floyd Turner (Pennridge) led the North with five tackles apiece. West's Nick Crognale and Jacob Blomgren each had four stops. Rupprecht also stripped Lewis at the goal line after the Bensalem receiver had made a sky-walking 30 yard catch late in the first half. Blomgren pounced on the loose ball at the North one-yard line . . . Pennridge's Matt Donohue registered a sack.
