Neshaminy tops C. Bucks West in last minute

Neshaminy dodged another bullet this week.

The Redskins, who beat Central Bucks West last Friday on the final play of the game, got a touchdown from Jamar Brittingham with 29 seconds left to slip past host Central Bucks East, 15-14, in a Suburban One National Conference football game yesterday.
