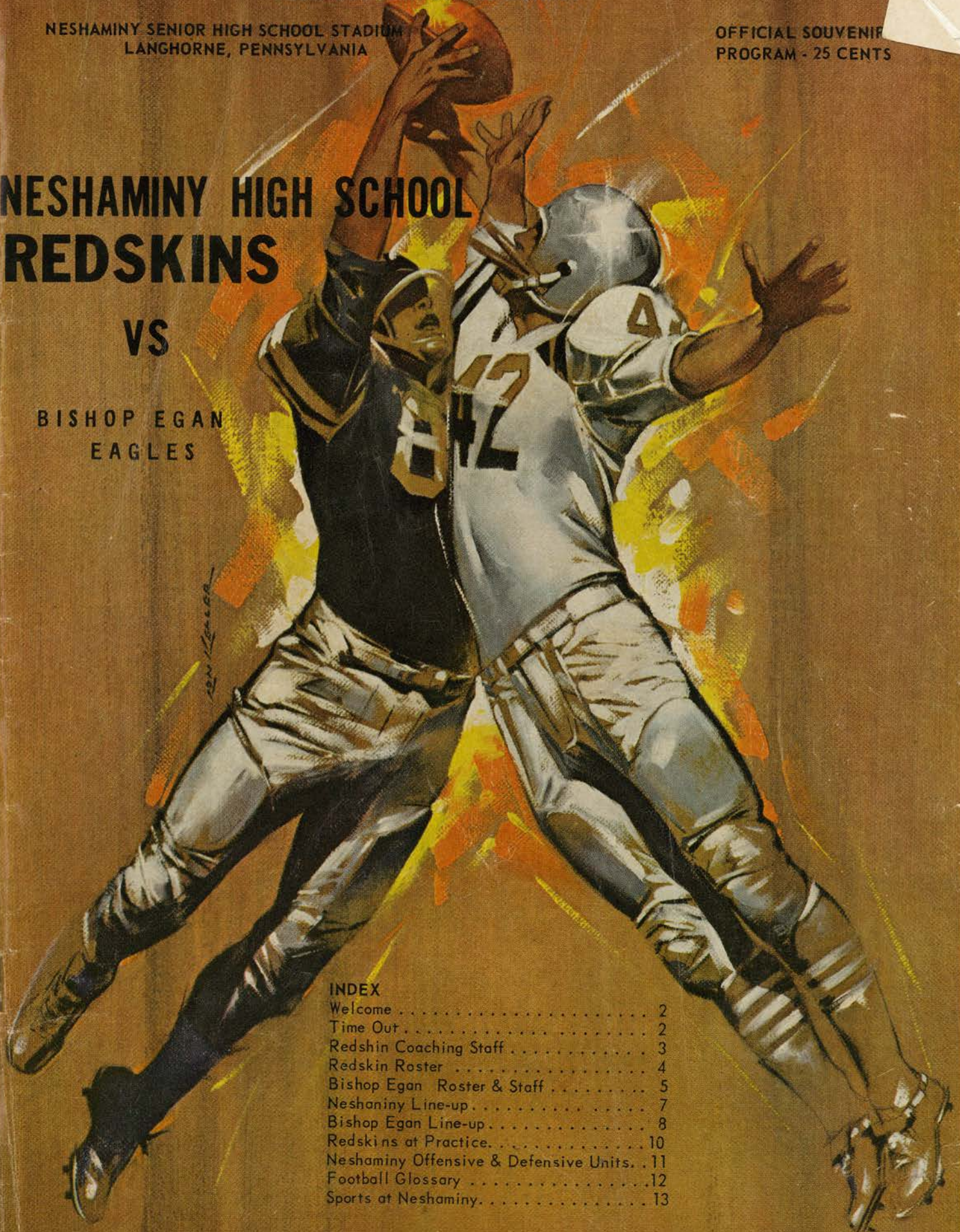

A LOOK AT BISHOP EGAN

Bishop Egan High School opened in 1957 as a co-educational institution located on the Levittown Parkway. In January, 1966 a new building was completed and Bishop Egan now has an all male enrollment of 1300. The girls now occupy the original school under the name of Bishop Conwell. Bishop Egan High School is a Diocesan school under the administration of the Franciscan Fathers, Third Order Regular, with Provincial Headquarters in Loretto, Pa.

LAST YEAR - Following their opening loss to Neshaminy's undefeated "11" the Egan Eagles rolled to an impressive 9 - 3 record including winning the Northern Division of the Philadelphia Catholic League. Coach Dick Bedesem, in his 10th year as head of the Eagles, will be facing the Redskins for the 7th time - so far the record stands at 6 wins for the Redskins - Will the Eagles come through with a victory or will the Redskins continue to dominate this rivalry?

PETER CORDELLI is an assistant coach at Neshaminy High School. After graduating from Blakely High School, he attended George Washington University. Coach Cordelli returned to his high school alma mater to coach for seven years and has been a member of the Neshaminy football staff for eight years. He also coaches Baseball and teaches Math and Physical Education.



ROBERT HART, assistant coach of the Redskins has been with Neshaminy four years. Coach Hart is a graduate of Morrisville High School and Penn State University. He teaches Science and Physical Education.



THEODORE ACETO, in his first year at Neshaminy as an assistant coach is a graduate of Gloucester Catholic High School and Villanova University. He coached the freshman football at Villanova from 1963-66, Ted will teach Social Studies.



JOSEPH KIRBY coaches the Neshaminy Junior Varsity. Coach Kirby graduated from Media High School and furthered his studies at West Chester State College. In his first year as football coach he also coaches J.V. Basketball and teaches Science.



JOSEPH PLUMERI also coaches the Junior Neshaminy gridders. He attended Trenton Catholic Boys High School Bordentown Military Institute and graduated from William and Mary College. A first year man at Neshaminy he also coaches J.V. Basketball and teaches Social Studies.

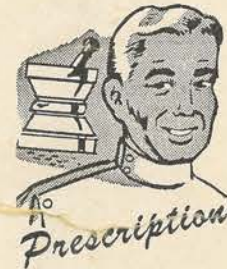

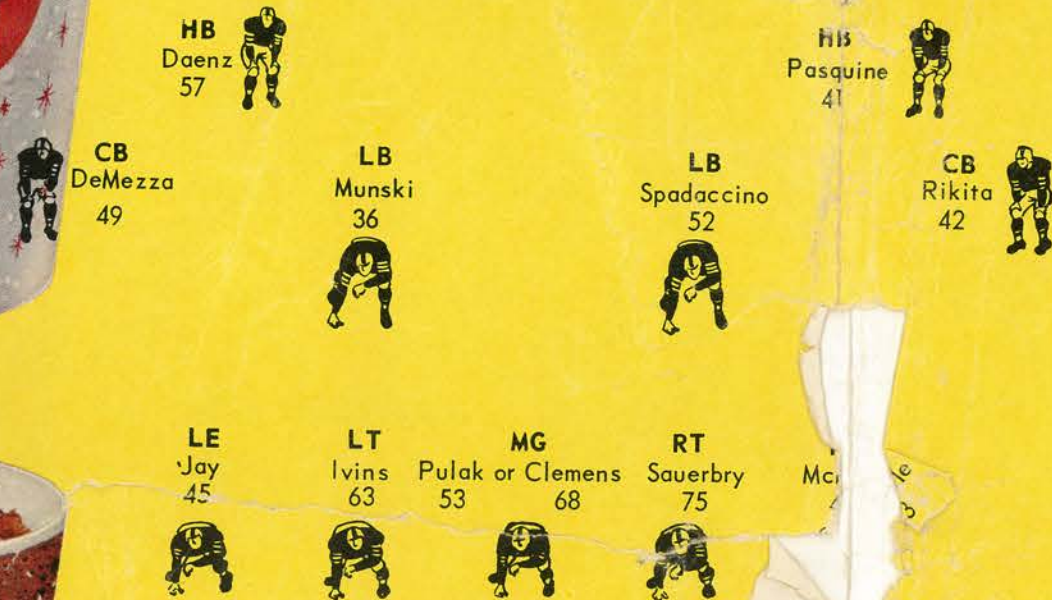

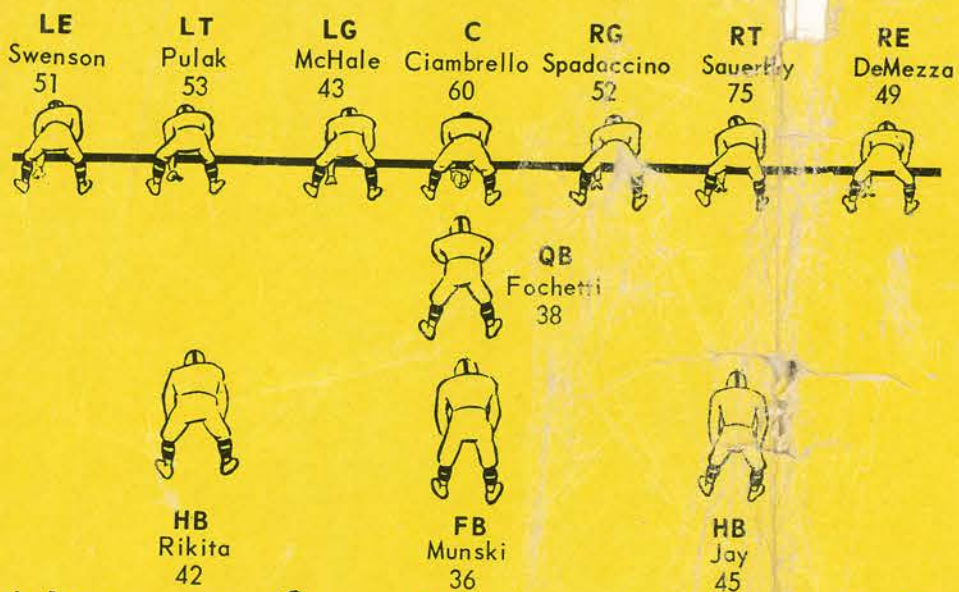

 Probable Starting Line-Up - Defense**

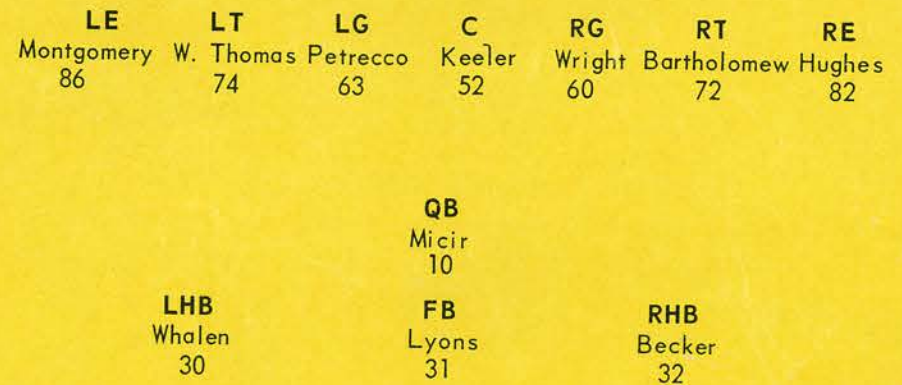


Probable Starting Line-Up - Offense

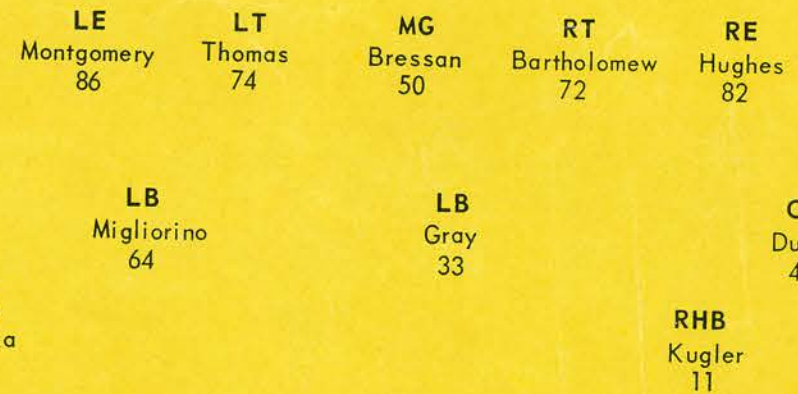

- FOOTBALL GLOSSARY -

Remember the Terms to help you get better acquainted with the sport.

Automatic – A change of the play called in the huddle by inserting into the starting commands a key phrase, word, or number that signals a new play. Called when the quarterback feels the defense is stacked against the first play or is vulnerable in some sector.

Bootleg – A sneak sweep by the quarterback, who fakes a hand-off, then takes off around end alone and with the ball concealed against his hip.

Button-hook – A pass-catching maneuver in which the receiver proceeds down field, then circles back sharply to face the passer and receive the ball.

Clipping – A block from the rear where contact is across the back of the leg of the player blocked.

Coffin Corner – The area formed by the goal line and the side line. A punt that goes out of bounds in this area, usually inside the ten-yard line, is called a "coffin corner kick."

Draw – A trap play in which the quarterback lures in defensive linemen by dropping back with the ball. When they are screened to the outside, the quarterback, or a back to whom he has handed off, takes the ball up the gap cleared by the onrushing defenders.

Fair Catch – An intent by a player by raising his arm not to advance a free kick. A player thus signalling cannot run with the ball nor can he be tackled.

Linebacker – A defensive player stationed just behind his line.

Monster – A floating linebacker, positioned either in or out of the line, on either side, or in any spot. His purpose is to confuse the opposition, varying his station and tactics from play to play.

Naked Reverse – A late-starting change-of-direction play, where, after large-scale initial flow of motion in one direction, the ball winds up in the possession of a back who goes in the other direction without blockers or interference.

Red Dog – When a linebacker leaves his position and crashes through the opposing line into the rival backfield to put pressure on the passer or to break up a play before it gets started. Also called "shooting the gap," "blitz," etc.

Roll-out – A sweeping run by the quarterback who, instead of dropping straight back on getting the ball, swings out in a wide arc to one side or another, ready to run or pass as the situation demands.

Shotgun – A spread-type attacking formation in which the quarterback lines up deep instead of under center, and the other backs are widely dispersed. It's an effective passing set-up, and disconcerting on running plays when the defense isn't prepared.

Slot – The gap left when an end is moved out from the tackle on his side. A back stationed in this position is called a slot-back or slot-man.

Tight end – An offensive end who lines up close to the tackle. When he lines up some distance out, he's called a "split end."

Trap – A maneuver in which the defensive lineman is permitted to come charging through and is blocked by surprise in the backfield. The play then goes through his vacated position.
