When tonight's game goes into the record book the first half of the season for Liberty High will have been completed and the final result will be of utmost importance to both the Hurricanes and Neshaminy which is paying its third visit to Liberty Stadium.

The battle pits a pair of head coaches in their first season at their respective schools, Tom McHugh at Neshaminy, and Bob Buffman at Liberty.

McHugh has the unenviable task of replacing John Petercuskie at Neshaminy and we say that because of the brilliant record the Redskins compiled during the latter's tenure. Petercuskie moved on to Dartmouth University after last season as an assistant after registering a 55-1-5 won-loss-tie record.

Thus far this season Neshaminy is winless with two ties and three losses in its first five efforts. However, before passing judgement on the Redskins' record, it might be well to note that one of the ties was a 19-19 battle with a rugged William Allen team.

Of course, the previous scores gives a reverse incentive to the Hurricanes who would like to be known as the first Liberty team to scalp the Redskins. It would also take some of the sting out of the Hurricanes' only setback of the current campaign, a 33-12 reversal to Pennsbury, Neshaminy's most fierce

Everyone was impressed with Liberty's bounceback performance only four days later when the Hurricanes defeated Allen, 21-20, in a game destined to be remembered as one of the best high school contests ever witnessed in the area.

100 Percent Team Win

While it's generally the backfield stars who attract most of the headlines, last Friday's victory was a team win in every sense of the word. Buffman started naming names of standouts after the game but stopped for fear that he might overlook someone when he sincerely felt that every player gave a 100 percent effort.

Victory is also essential for Liberty if the Red and Blue gridders are to remain in contention for the first Big Six Conference title. Although the circuit was formed prior to this season, Liberty and Pennsbury did not meet. Only the second game with William Allen counts in Conference standings which means Liberty is 0-1.

Win or lose tonight, if the Hurricanes perform in the same fashion as they did against Allen, there won't be any Liberty fans leaving the stadium disappointed. And if they do duplicate their Allen game performance, it's very likely that Liberty kids will be one step closer to the first winning season since







ATHLETIC PROGRAM OF LIBERTY HIGH SCHOOL

The athletic program of Bethlehem High School, extensive in scope and based on sound principles of administration, seeks to meet the physical, emotional, and recreational needs of adolescents. Through well-planned activities-inter-scholastic and intra-mural-under the direction of a competent staff excellent opportunities are provided for participation by a large segment of the school population. Experiences are offered which stimulate the development of motor skills and also promote good physical and mental health.

Athletic policies are developed by an Athletic Council, comprising the Superintendent of Schools, High School Principal, Director of Athletics and three to five members of the Board of Education. The Council's decisions are recommended to the Board of Education for their approval.

The program, despite its extensiveness is largely self-sustaining, through revenue derived from football and basketball. All costs associated with the sponsoring ten (10) interscholastic sports are defrayed through revenue secured from public support of these activities. The stadium, the debt of which was amortized annually, was completely paid for in the Spring of 1953. The major portion of the sports program of the four junior high schools is also financed.

Outdoor activities are conducted in an area of approximately ten acres—an area immediately adjacent to the school plant and one which insures one of the most modern programs of physical education activities. The huge stadium, immediately to the rear of the Memorial Gymnasium was constructed in 1938 and is capable of seating 16,588 persons. The modern Memorial Gymnasium, erected in 1955 and having a seating capacity for four thousand (4,000) persons, offers excellent facilities for physical education and athletics particularly basketball and wrestling. Additional land area offers facilities for tennis, soccer, baseball, softball, track, archery, and hockey.

The entire athltic program seeks to meet the present and probable future health needs of growing boys and girls. Bethlehem prides itself on the excellent quality of sportsmanship which prevails, and conscientious efforts are constantly expended to insure courteous treatment of opponents by participants and spectators alike. Further, Bethlehem's representatives have gone on to greater triumphs in collegiate circles and quite a number have graced the rolls of All-American selections.

Bethlehem High School is dedicated to the task of continuing to offer the finest physical education activities necessary to insure physical, mental, and emotional fitness and to evaluate these activities in terms of the objectives of the entire school program.
