

Baxter Leads Scoring Parade With 42 Points

Blame Bob Baxter for making the Lower Bucks County football scoring race seem repetitious.

The Neshaminy High fullback has assumed the pace-setter role — of which he is quite familiar — while attempting to defend the championship captured in record-breaking fashion a year ago.

Baxter, offensive sparkplug for the unbeaten (4-0-1) Redskins, has scored 42 points in five games to forge ahead of previous leader Paul Horwatt of Wilson High who now totals 32.

A 21-point performance during the second half against Allen High matched Baxter's point total of the previous four contests while moving him to the fore.

six touchdowns and six extra point placements. Incidentally, it totals all but 14 points (minus Bill Brundzo's two TDs and a safety) scored by Neshaminy so far this campaign.

Ranking behind Baxter and runner-up Horwatt are Delhaas halfback Paul Pitetti and Bishop Egan quarterback Bill Creedon with 24 points each, and Egan halfback Johnny Kerr with 21.

Then come Bob Burkhart, Pennsbury (19); Jack Klebe, Bensalem, and Dan Robertson, Wilson (both 13), and 10 players who have scored 12—three each from Wilson and Pennsbury.

Baxter and Klebe have both booted the same number of extra points—six—so far this season. Last year Baxter kicked 35 which together with 26 touchdowns gave him 191 points in 11 games for the individual scoring record.
