

# Rementer, Ryan Make All-Area

Steve Rementer of Ridley Township and Frank Ryan of St. James have been named to the All-Southeastern Pennsylvania All-Offense team in selections released by the Embee Scholastic Football Survey.

Rementer landed a guard post, while Ryan was named as a halfback.

Others on the first team of offensive unit include: ends John Zelis of Phoenixville and Gary Steele of Woodrow Wilson; tackles George Katzenbach of Roxborough and Ray Jenkins of Neshaminy; guard John McMahon of LaSalle; center Homer Ashy of Central; quarterback John Pergine of Plymouth-Whitemarsh; and backs Bob Baxer of Neshaminy and Butch Griffith of Upper Merion.

Zelis, Steele, Katzenbach and Pergine were also named to the defensive team.

Others on that squad are: tackle Greg Shelly of Souderton; guard Mike Manderino of Lower Merion; linebackers Bill Pergine of Plymouth-Whitemarsh, Irv Wright of Norristown and Gene Weidemoyer of Souderton; and backs Bill Brundzo of Neshaminy and Jim Lampe of Penn Charter.

Plymouth-Whitemarsh was rated the top team in the area, followed by Neshaminy, Lower Merion, Phoenixville, Bishop Egan, St. James, Souderton, West Catholic, Upper Perkiomen, St. Joseph's, Penn Charter, Quakertown, Ridley Township, Pennridge and Upper Darby.

Phoenixville (11-0) Roxborough (8-0) and Penn Charter (7-0) were the only unbeaten teams among the schools. Unbeaten, but once-tied records were fashioned by Neshaminy (9-0-1), Interboro (8-0-1) and P-W (8-0-1).

Paul Horwatt of Woodrow Wilson scored 114 points to win the Southeastern scoring crown. Ryan was second with 100 points, followed by Baxter with 99.

The Embee Survey includes all four Suburban Leagues, plus the Catholic, Inter-Academic, Public, Bux-Mont, Ches-Mont, Inter-County, Suburban Catholic and Lower Bucks Leagues.
