

Dieruff Deadlocks Neshaminy, 7-7

"We like to play Neshaminy," said Dieruff's head football coach, Ernie Wescoe, after his Huskies held the Redskins to a 7-7 draw in a Big Six League game last night before 5,500 fans at the Neshaminy High Athletic Field.

Not only do the Huskies like to play Neshaminy, they always do a splendid job against the powerful Redskins.

In the last 25 grid tussles in which the Coach John Petercuskie teams have played, Neshaminy has won 22 and tied three. Dieruff tied them 6-6 last year, while losing a tough 13-6 setto in 1963.

Neshaminy still leads the Big Six with a 2-0-1 record (4-0-1 overall) while Dieruff of Allentown is 0-1-1 in the league and 2-1-2 overall. One of the ties was with Woodrow Wilson, 0-0.

The Redskins started the game last night like it would be a runaway. After almost scoring in the opening moments, Neshaminy tallied the second time it got the oval.

Long Kickoff Return

Tom Thompson took the opening kickoff on his own 10, zig-zaged through a host of would-be tacklers and got all the way to the Allentown school's 31. He was stopped after 59 yards on a nifty tackle by Warren (Butch) Kline.

Bob Rotolo gained nine to the 22 on the next play. But the next three tries lost eight yards and Dieruff took over on its 30.

Three pass attempts all failed and Dieruff punted. Starting on their own 36, the Redskins gained 14 yards in four ground plays. A five-yard penalty put them back on the 45.

Then came Neshaminy's big play of the night, good for 55 yards and a touchdown.

A Great Run

Quarterback Jim Colbert was hit twice in the backfield, but broke loose at the middle of the field. He cut to his left and headed for the sideline dodging two Huskies. Cutting sharply to his right, he picked up blockers and went scouting into the right corner for the TD.

George Nolte placekicked and it was 7-0, with five minutes left to play in the first period. Later in the same period Neshaminy notched another first down, but it was the last for 37 minutes.

The next, and only additional stick move came on the final play of the game, giving Neshaminy four first downs.

Dieruff tied the game with 35 seconds left in the third quarter. The Huskies moved 53 yards in 11 plays and three first downs. They connected four times in five aerial attempts, the long one being a 28-yarder from Rich Studenich to Jim Dorward to the 11.

Pass Nets T.D.

Three tries got three yards. On the fourth down Studenich hoisted an eight-yard pass to Milton Carl in the right corner of the end zone. Gene Stahler calmly placekicked the score to 7-7.

The first three times Neshaminy had the ball in the fourth period it had to punt. The fourth time a pass was intercepted but the Redskins got the ball back on the next play by recovering a fumble.

Three straight passes failed (seven misses out of seven) and with three seconds left, Colbert couldn't find a receiver so he ran and got 15 yards — and the only stick move in over three periods.

The deadlock had plenty of defensive heroes. For Neshaminy it was Harry Hoffman setting the pace with Steve Madden, Alan Jay, Fred Conger, Rich Settles and Steve Whitehurst. For the Huskies it was Frank Weierbach making most

of the stops followed by Fred Blunt, Chris Samuels, Jim Molchan, Fred Weaver and Butch Kline.
