The Lower Bucks County Scholarship Bowl Committee has cancelled this year's All-Star Football Game scheduled for June 26, at the Neshaminy Field. We have been unable to obtain the necessary N.C.A.A. sanction due to a March 14 deadline for filing applications. To play this game without sanction would jeopardize the eligibility of anyone who would later attend a N.C.A.A. school.

The deadline date was something we were not aware of and even though we more than met their qualifications, we still could not obtain their approval. Congressman Willard Curtin wrote to the N.C.A.A. and also influenced other high government officials to write in our behalf. They informed him they would like to waive the deadline date in our case but would have to do the same for eight other games and this would be setting a precedent which would create many problems in the future.

A project this large required the help and advice of many people, all of whom donated their time and efforts knowing there would be no remuneration of any nature. We wish to thank:

The School Superintendents, Principals, and Athletic Directors for their advice and cooperation in helping to set up this Committee.

The Neshaminy School Board for approval to use the Neshaminy Field.

The Football Coaches Association of Lower Bucks County who offered to coach the boys and supervise the game. This meant giving up a vacation to several of the coaches.
