

Redskins' Colbert Leads Grid Scoring

Jim Colbert, Neshaminy quarterback, is the leader (by a slim one-touchdown margin) with 72 total points in the scoring parade for the high schools in Lower Bucks County 1965 football with three weekends of play remaining.

The 6-2, 185-pound signal-caller for the Redskins has 12 touchdowns in eight games. His closest three rivals, all from different schools, have played less games and will get opportunities to cut into his lead.

Jim Broadwater, (6-2, 200) of Pennsbury, is the runnerup with 11 TD's and 66 points, followed

by Alex Mocknatch (6-1, 190) of Bensalem Township, with 10 six-pointers and 60 points. Both have played one less contest than the Neshaminy quarterback.

Next in the standings is Council Rock's Craig Robinson (5-10, 160) who has participated in all of the Indian six encounters — two less than Neshaminy.

Late Comer

Mocknatch, Bensalem's hard-charging ballcarrier, has made the biggest advance lately in getting near the top. The Owl ace notched seven of his 10 TD's in his last three games.

Interesting sidelights regarding the four leaders, (a) are all seniors in school (b) represent four teams and (c) make up a complete backfield: Colbert, quarterback; Broadwater, fullback; Mocknatch and Robinson, halfbacks.

Out of the 19 top scorers, Pennsbury and Council Rock lead with four representatives each while Bensalem is next with three.

Eight of 12 high schools participating in the gridiron sport have boys in the listed top 19. Not represented are Bristol Lower Moreland, George School and Archbishop Wood.
