

# Neshaminy Sets Back Bethlehem Behind Kaminski's 3 TDs, 40-19

Neshaminy scored early — and often — last night, belting Bethlehem, 40-19, before 11,500 at Liberty Stadium.

The well-drilled Redskins from the strong Lower Bucks County Conference capitalized on an early blocked punt and a pass interception and then scored their third touchdown on a fumble recovery in a strong second half. Another scoring bid died as time ran out.

Ted Kaminski paced the Skins with his powerful running. He scored three times and also passed 33 yards for a score to end Rich McHale.

Quarterback Bob Rotollo mixed his plays well, connected on several key passes and showed some classy running. He sprinted for a 19-yard TD run in the second quarter.

The unbeaten but once-tied Skins also got a 59-yard scor-

ing jaunt by Bob Barr with 7:36 remaining in the game.

The Hurricane (3-2) made a game of it in the first half when Gary Ripple scored a pair of touchdowns.

Ripple scored on a 10-yard sprint to cap a 62-yard drive early in the quarter. With 1:45 left in the half, he fought off two Redskin defenders in the end zone to haul in a 22-yard pass from Joe Saurino and tie the game, 13-13.

Neshaminy bounced back quickly and moved 62 yards in four plays with Rotollo scoring from the 19. Prior to the dash, Kaminski caught a 32-yard aerial from Rotollo. Hurricane defender Tom Gutai had attempted an interception but deflected the ball into Kaminski's hands.

The Redskins scored with 3:56 gone in the game when guard John Troyana blocked Leo Pietrouchie's punt. Neshaminy took over on the 6 and on fourth down, Kaminski smashed into the end zone.

Six minutes later Kaminski scored a second time to end a

43-yard march. Jack Dunn picked off Saurino's pass to start the ball moving.

In the second quarter, Bethlehem managed to get to Neshaminy's 15 on the strength of a 53-yard Saurino to Jerry Zerfass pass play. The drive ended back on the 23.

The Hurricane threatened in the third period until Barr intercepted Saurino's pass on the Skins' 8.

Neshaminy struck for two quick TDs in the third period — the first drive covering 56 yards in four plays and the second going 31 yards after Steve Pyle recovered Saurino's fumble.

The final Redskin scoring march covered 69 yards in two plays with Barr fighting off numerous defenders on a 59-yard dash.

Ed Butch capped the Hurricane's final drive, going over from the 4 early in the last period.

Both teams suffered crucial injuries. Admitted to St. Luke's Hospital was Redskins quarterback Frank Wurst with a possible kidney injury. Guzzo was treated for a neck sprain.

Neshaminy also lost fullback Ted Boerckel with a leg injury on the first play of the game. Zerfass sat out most of the second half with a knee injury and substitute Steve Vadjia bulled his way for several nice gains.
