LANGHORNE — Bob Baxter and Bill Brundzo, a pair of Neshaminy halfbacks who broke Bethlehem's back last season, did exactly the same thing Friday night before a crowd of 8,500.

The pair of boys rushed for one touchdown each and Baxter added a placement to lead the Redskins past the Hurricane, 13-0.

The victory enabled Neshaminy to capture the recently formed East Penn League crown with a 4-0 record. On the season, the Redskins own a 6-0-1 slate, having been tied by La Salle of Philadelphia.

once all night in the defensive battle. Thus, the Hurricane bowed for the second time in five contests.

The Hurricane's threat came after it took the opening kickoff. Starting on its 23, Bethlehem moved in eight plays to the Neshaminy 19 where two pass incompletions killed the threat.

Baxter's 2-yard plunge midway through the third period broke a scoreless tie. The drive started when Tom Dee returned the second-half kickoff from his 25 to Bethlehem's 44 on a reverse.

The Redskins moved the 44 yards in 10 plays with Baxter, an all-stater and Big 33 selection, smashing over from the 2. Baxter added the placement for a 7-0 Neshaminy margin.

Ted Boerker set up the Redskins second touchdown when he picked off Joe Saurino's aerial on Neshaminy's 42 and returned it 41 yards to the Hurricane 17 in the final period. Five plays later Brundzo went over from the 2.

The attempted place kick failed and the 'Skin had to be satisfied with a 13-0 lead, which was good enough for the victory.

The only other time Bethlehem drove deep into the Redskins territory was late in the opening period. Getting good running from Denny Inman, Mike Harris and Jerry Zerfass, the Hurricane moved from its 37 to the 'Skins' 32.
