

Neshaminy Victor Over Allen, 19-7

No one really expected a capacity crowd last night in Allentown School District Stadium. Nor did they expect Allen to give Neshaminy too much trouble.

On the first count they were right — about 15,000 spectators were in the stands. But where the Canaries were concerned, they were dead wrong.

The powerful Lower Bucks Conference Redskins gained a 19-7 victory to extend their unbeaten record to 45 games and compiled a huge statistical margin, but it took them more than three quarters to wear down the determined and hopeful Canaries.

In the final analysis it was Neshaminy's fine, quick line and a flock of fast, hard-hitting backs which spoiled Coach George Halfacre's home opener. With quarterback Jim Colbert directing the Redskins as magnificently as expected, the visitors dominated the entire second half and finally broke free on scoring runs by Colbert and George Pasquine.

Colbert's quick sneak over left guard with 8:33 left in the game covered the last two yards of a 79-yard, 12-play drive. The final touchdown was easy, Neshaminy covering 56 yards in only five plays. Pasquine went the last 14 yards through right tackle although he was hit sev-

eral times — once behind the line of scrimmage.

So in control were the Redskins in the last two periods that they executed 37 plays to only 15 for Allen, and the Canaries' total included three punts and seven passes.

It was considerably different in the first half, although here also the visitors dominated the statistics. With Jerry Barr, Bob Rotolo and Colbert doing the running, they moved 80 yards in 11 plays the first time they had the ball to take a 7-0 lead. Colbert on his first rollout of the night went 26 yards around left end to spark the drive which ended when Barr cracked over tackle from the 1. George Nolte kicked the point.

Geoff Baum's fumble recovery on the Allen 49 with only seconds left in the opening period set up Allen's score. Quarterback Joe Tomcho and Pete Moggio ran to the Neshaminy 46. Then, on a third- and-five situation, Tomcho rifled a long bullet pass to Moggio near the left sideline and the Canary halfback made a sensational catch in the clear at the 18. It was a simple matter to get the rest of the way to the end zone. Ken Cressman's conversion tied it.

From there until the final 12 minutes the Canaries did a superb job of keeping Colbert's rollouts in check, with Baum, Bob McFarland and Cressman turning in key plays. But there was no stopping Barr, Rotolo and, in the second half, Dick Settles, who roared through gaping holes — especially on the right side of the Canary line — to pile up huge yardage. The

Redskins finished with 20 first downs and 332 yards rushing.

Settles and Baum were injured in the latter part of the game and were admitted to Allentown Hospital for possible concussions.

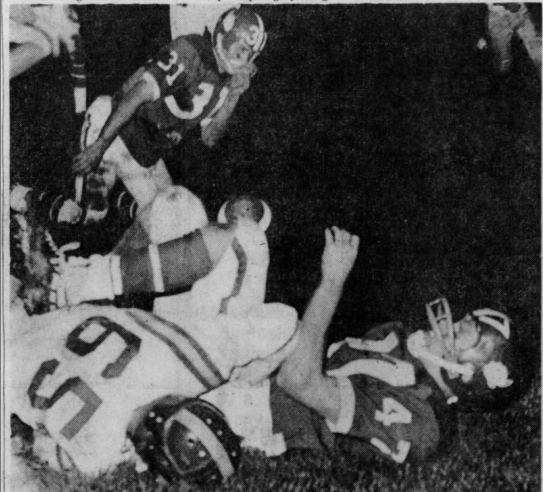
