

Neshaminy Rips Delhaas, 53-0

Neshaminy High's Redskins win football games two ways—by luck or by brute force—but they always seem to win, at least in Lower Bucks county competition.

The unbeaten Redskins (9-0-1) wound up their seventh unbeaten Lower Bucks season Friday night with a 53-0 rout of hapless Delhaas that featured the ultimate in brute force.

KAMINSKI SCORES 3

Champions of the East Penn and LB Section One leagues, the Redskins scored 28 points in the second period and coasted to victory. Leading the attack was halfback Bill Kaminski who scored three touchdowns on runs of 62 and six yards and a 52-yard punt return.

Defensive halfback Gerald Barr, a 5-11, 155-pound junior, provided the most electrifying moment of the night when he intercepted a pass in the Redskins' end zone and raced 103 yards for a touchdown.

Other touchdowns were scored by quarterback Jim Colbert, on runs of 12 and 27 yards, George Kissinger, 43-yard run, and Jim Walker, 39-yard run.

Paul Moxley scored two touchdowns as Bishop Egan (4-6) dropped Notre Dame, of Trenton, from the unbeaten ranks, 26-6, at Levittown. Also scoring for the Eagles were Gred Guiteras and Frank Davis.
