Pennridge Wins 7th in Row

Pennridge High's unbeaten Rams continued their march toward the Bux-Mont League championship Friday night when they toppled visiting Hatboro-Horsham, 22-6, for their seventh victory and sixth in the league.

Meanwhile, Neshaminy's once-tied Redskins, who last week clinched their second straight East Penn Conference crown, opened defense of their Lower Bucks Section One championship with a 9-2 victory over stubborn Woodrow Wilson.

Pennridge scored in every period to hand Hatboro its fifth loss in six games.

In other Bux-Mont action, Souderton overcame a 12-0 half-time deficit to bury North Penn, 33-19, for its fifth victory in six games. Tim Evans threw two scoring passes to Bruce Kratz to pace the winners.

Central Bucks (3-3) handed

Springfield (Montco) its sixth straight loss, 35-13, as Brian McCullough scored three touchdowns on runs of 52, 34 and 39 yards. McCullough rushed for a CB record of 268 yards.

Also, Quakertown (4-2) eked out a 15-7 victory over visiting Upper Moreland, as Kent Swartley and Bob Johnston tallied for the winner.

Neshaminy (6-0-1) scored midway through the first period, then held on to trip Wilson (5-2). On the first play from scrimmage, Wilson's Greg Thompson fumbled and Neshaminy's Jim Walker recovered on the Presidents' 35. Thirteen plays later, Jim Colbert plunged over from the one.

In a Lower Bucks inter-sectional clash, William Tennent

(2-4) coasted to a 32-8 decision over Morrisville (2-4) as Gerry Zweitzig scored one TD and passed for another.

Hun School, of Princeton, assured itself of at least a tie for the Penn-Jersey Conference crown by thumping visiting Friends Central, 35-6, for its fifth victory without a loss. George School (2-2) scored twice in the last period to edge Germantown Friends, 12-6.

Pottstown (2-5) defeated visiting West Chester, 14-0, in a Ches-Mont League test on touchdowns by Dan Weller and Larry Butler.

Wildwood (3-2) handed winless Hammonton its fourth Cape-Atlantic League loss, 32-6, paced by two touchdowns by George Jackson.

In non-league play, Warren McManus scored three six-pointers as Peddie School (3-3) routed visiting Newark Academy, 19-6, and Gloucester Catholic (4-1-1) battled host Holy Spirit (4-0-1), of Atlantic City, to a scoreless tie.
