

Neshaminy Switches to 'T'

After 11 years of the single-wing, football coach John Petercuskie has introduced a new offense at Neshaminy High School this season.

Petercuskie said Neshaminy will use a wing "T" against its Lower Bucks County League confederates this fall.

The new formation is more suited to his 17 regulars from last year's club, Petercuskie noted.

ONE LOSS LAST YEAR

Neshaminy, the football powerhouse among Bucks county high schools for the last three years, registered a 9-0-1 record last season.

The Lions' only blemish on an otherwise perfect record was a scoreless tie against LaSalle High School.

Walker, tailback Bill Kaminski, and linebackers Howard O'Dell, Jack Dunn and Ted Borckel.

IN 11TH SEASON

Neshaminy has already scrimmaged North Penn and Clark Summit of Scranton. Petercuskie said he was "pleased" with both outings.

Petercuskie, beginning his 11th season at Neshaminy, is assisted by Jack Swartz, Pete Cordelli, Bob Hart, Joe Grey-pod and Dick Smith.

Promising prospects include quarterbacks Jim Colbert, Bob Rotolo and Ernie Forchetti.

BISHOP EGAN FRIDAY

Both Colbert and Rotolo are juniors, while Forchetti is a sophomore. Petercuskie said Colbert, who stands 6-foot-2 and weighs 175 pounds, is the club's starting quarterback "at the moment."

Other prospects are tailbacks Jerry Barr and Bob Cassady and fullback Bob Munski.

Petercuskie sends his club against Bishop Egan, Catholic League champs, in a non-league

encounter on Friday. Other games are slated with LaSalle High School on Sept. 18 and Easton High School, Sept. 25.
