

# Doylestown Hosts All-Star Football Game On Saturday

Will it be a wide open game? One with plenty of pinpoint passing, wide end sweeps, and quarterback option plays to keep the all-star defensive linebackers alert?

Or will it be a conservative game? One in which the county's best power runners try grinding out yardage against the strongest lines that can be assembled from the county's senior all stars?

This year's Bucks County Lions All-Star football game could easily be both.

When the North and South teams line up for the opening kickoff at 8 p.m. on Saturday, June 13 at Doylestown's War Memorial Field, it will be more than just a clash between two highly talented football teams. It will be a confrontation between two distinctly different coaching styles.

Chuck Kane, head coach at Pennsbury High School, is a master of the grind-out-the-yardage game and is expected to have the South squad test the North's defensive line early in the contest. Throughout his career, he has developed hard running backs and tough offensive lines that have made their marks on the Lower Bucks County League. While his high school teams have won championships, he still is looking for his first Bucks County All Star victory.

Although Peiffer has served as an all star assistant coach, this will be his first year at the helm of the Northern aggregation of talented seniors. He became football mentor at Quakertown High in 1978 after serving 15 years as assistant coach and immediately installed a multi-faceted offense. One of his assistants at Quakertown and in the All-Star game is Doug Shobert who broke a host of offensive records as quarterback at Central Bucks West High School and later at Temple University.

North teams hold a 3-2-2 edge in the

All-Star series which began in 1972. The South's only victories were posted in 1973 and 74 while the '78 and '79 games ended in ties. Kane's team will try to improve the South's record by avenging its 27-21 loss to the North in 1980.

Tickets for the All-Star contest can be purchased at any Bucks County High School and from members of Lions Clubs. They will go on sale at War Memorial Field at 8 p.m., Saturday, June 13. Proceeds from the game are used by the Lions to support Blind Charities throughout the county.
