District I Backs: It Was a Very Good Year

Running backs gobbled up most of the spotlight in District 1 this fall, a fact that is reflected by the quality of ballcarriers heading the senior-dominated 1986 Daily News All-Suburban

Start with the best of the lot - Mike Beasley, of Owen J. Roberts. Even though he missed one game because of an injury and ran behind an inexperienced line, he still managed to rush for 1,356 yards, pushing his career total to 3,293. He also threw for two touchdowns, ran two kickoffs back for TDs, and more than held his own in the defensive secondary while carrying the Wildcats to a 12-0 record.

Then there's Ernest Pendleton, of Lower Merion, Despite playing hurt much of the time, he accumulated 1,437 yards this season, pushing his three-year total to 3,714. That is fourth-best in Southeastern Pennsylvania history.

The other first-teamer is Academy Park's Steve Williams, who ran for an area-high 1,771 yards. And the starting all-purpose man is Abington's Chris Roberts, who finished with 1,236 yards this season, 3,049 for his career, and was also a dangerous kick

The second-team contingent of Norristown's Dan Boyd (1,423 yards), Spring-Ford's Bob Wiggins (1,464 yards, area-high 170 points), Glen Mills's Tyrone Wilson (1,616 yards in 10 games, 9.9 er carry average) and all-purpose Rodney Blackwell of Penn

Wood (1,359 yards, super on returns) wasn't too shabby, either. In most years, honorable mentions such as Chester's Anthony McClain, West Chester Henderson's Erik Lund and Downingtown's Ralph Miller probably would have been on one of the

In addition, the top three defensive backs doubled as prime offensive threats. Louis Riddick, of Pennridge, and Larry Waugh, of Abington, two of the fiercest hitters around, each rushed for over 1,000 yards, while Strath Haven's Monte Rice used his speed and sure hands to develop into a game-breaking

And if you wanted to travel through the air, the weapons were definitely here.

Ridley's Matt Blundin, regarded as one of the better quarterback prospects to emerge from this area in some time, missed three games and most of another with calcium deposits on his knee. Nevertheless, he threw for 1,196 yards and 11 touchdowns.

His main target on the Green Raiders, Rob Graf, caught 50 basses for 965 yards. Phoenixville's Steve Brill had 38 receptions for 659 yards for a team that didn't throw all that much. And Interboro's George Deveney, who also excelled at defensive end, just as easily could have been honored as a wideout on the basis of his 48 catches for 900 yards.
