

# Big 33 Checklist

A total of 28 players were nominated state-wide during the second week of the Big 33 Checklist, conducted by the Pennsylvania Scholastic Football Coaches Association and a panel of sportswriters from across the state.

This week's list includes the following players:

● Jason Godusky (5-10, 180 HB), Emmaus, 31 carries for 201 yards and two touchdowns on runs of 39 and five yards in loss to Hatboro-Horsham.

● Frank Reightler (5-11, 160 HB), Catasauqua, scored three touchdowns and ran for 149 yards on 22 carries in win over Northern Lehigh.

● Steve Tone (6-2, 236 MLB-OT), Notre Dame, scored two touchdowns defensively, one on a 21-yard run with a fumble recovery, and the other on a 17-yard interception in a win over Wilson.

● Chris Due (5-8, 155 HB-DB), Bangor, gained 92 yards on 10 carries and caught a pass for 24 yards. He had two quarterback sacks and a fumble recovery on defense.

● Joe Weaver (6-2, 200 TB-Safety), Littlestown, 15 carries for 90 yards, threw a 71-yard touchdown option pass, intercepted two passes, and led his team in tackles in win over Waynesboro.

● Dan Weissenberg (5-11, 160 DB), Neshaminy, intercepted two passes.

● Tim Ford (5-10, 170 QB), Neshaminy, threw touchdown passes of 25 and 26 yards and completed six of eight passes for 91 yards.

● Doug Womer (6-2, 180 QB), Bald Eagle Area, completed 12 of 16 passes for 147 yards and one TD in win over Bald Eagle-Nittany.

● Dean Rossman (6-0, 170 RB), Penns Valley, ran for 121 yards and two touchdowns on 20 carries in win over Moshannon Valley.

● Jim Frank (5-10, 185 TB), Bethlehem Liberty, rushed for 121 yards and two touchdowns on 13 carries. His TD runs covered 35 and 39 yards in loss to Bethlehem Catholic.

● Steve Hooper (5-9, 157 TB), Nazareth, 22 carries for 158 yards and one TD in win over Lehigh.

● Tim Downey (5-11, 170 WR), Bensalem Township, caught five passes for 100 yards, including a 56-yarder for a TD.

● Bill Zoldi (QB-DB), Morrisville, threw a 38-yard TD pass, ran for another score, and made numerous tackles and forced a fumble on defense.

● Gerald Toney (6-1, 175 WR), Morrisville, returned punts of 45 and 55

yards for touchdowns and scored on a 38-yard TD pass.

● Chris Wahl (6-1, 195 TB), Central Bucks East, 25 carries for 177 yards and three touchdowns, one a 61-yarder.

● Shawn Ortman (5-11, 145 DB), Pennsbury, intercepted two passes in his first varsity start.

● Dave Harrison (6-1, 190 LB), Pennsbury, was the leading tackler for his team in last week's win.

● Tom Waterbor (6-1, 190 RB), Neshaminy, carried nine times for 72 yards, including a 44-yard TD, and caught two passes, one a 25-yard TD.

● Greg Horney (5-11, 170 FB-LB), West Branch, gained 180 yards on 24 carries in a win over Marion Center.

● Mike Goslee (5-10, 165 HB-DE), DuBois, ran for 176 yards on eight carries and two touchdowns in a win over Lock Haven.

● Jeff Peterson (5-9, 165 TB-LB), Johnsonburg, rushed for 275 yards and four touchdowns on 30 carries. Two of his TDs covered 42 and 50 yards in a win over Elk County Christian.

● Mike Cara (5-7, 167 TB), Hazleton, gained 133 yards on seven carries and one TD in a victory over West Hazleton.

● Andy Macko (6-2, 200 C-DE), Wilkes-Barre GAR, returned an interception 21 yards for a touchdown and forced a second interception during a win over Crestwood. The TD was the second defensive score of the season for Macko.

● Joe Novitski (6-2, 192 QB-DB), Wyoming Valley West, threw for one touchdown, ran for another and had an interception in a victory over Pittston Area. He also punted three times for a 36.3 average, and all three punts pinned Pittston inside its 20-yard line.

● Vernon Perry (6-2, 230 OT), Berwick, played a key role in his team's one-point win over Harrisburg. Berwick had 210 yards rushing, with most of those yards coming on Perry's side. Berwick has won 45 games in a row.

● Sean Barowski (6-3, 225 FB-LB), Bishop McDevitt, had 109 yards of total offense (42 yards rushing, 67 yards on pass receptions), and punted three times for a 40-yard average.

● Norm Saunders (5-10, 165 RB), Erie Cathedral Prep, rushed for 167 yards and two touchdowns on 21 carries in a win over Pittsburgh Brashear.

● Ken Poling (RB), Frazier, gained 368 yards and scored five touchdowns on 23 carries.
