

# Edison rallies in

Quarterback Joe Jefferson scored on a keeper in the third quarter, and Tony Garcia's safety during the same quarter provided the decisive points as visiting Edison shocked Gratz, 10-8, yesterday in the Public League Mid-City Division opener for both teams.

The Inventors, whose only win in their last 10 games was a forfeit victory over William Penn last season, scored their first points since the 1984 season when Jefferson capped a 70-yard drive with his 2-yard TD run.

Edison then tied the score at 8-8 with a two-point conversion pass from Jefferson to Rod Johnakin.

The Inventors took the lead when Garcia sacked the Gratz quarterback in the end zone.

"I told the kids to enjoy this win, because we're in first place," said Edison's fourth-year coach, Larry Oliver. "Nobody else in the division played today. Central [the defending league champion] didn't play and Germantown didn't play. I told the kids that we're on a roll.

"It's been a real struggle this year," Oliver said, "and this first win is a big one. We're just hoping to get this program back to the level that it used to be, and I think that we might be on our way."
