

Mark Hartnett converted a 22-yard field goal with 22 seconds left in the game to give host Central Bucks West a 16-14 win over Neshaminy in a Suburban One League National Conference game last night.

The win marked the third time this season that West, the top-ranked team in Southeastern Pennsylvania according to The Inquirer's coaches poll, needed a Hartnett field goal to seal a victory.

In the league opener for the Bucks (5-0 overall, 3-0 league) against Downingtown, Hartnett's 28-yard field goal was the only score of the game. Last week against Council Rock, the 6-foot-2, 185-pound senior's 23-yard field goal provided the winning margin.

Neshaminy, the area's 10th-ranked team, used scoring runs by Bill Vergantino and Dick Dougherty in its upset bid.
