

# Langhorne stuns 4th-ranked Egan

Neshaminy-Langhorne High, under first-year coach Jim Weber, stunned visiting Bishop Egan, 14-7, last night. Egan entered the game ranked by *The Inquirer* as No. 4 in the state.

Neshaminy junior halfback Bob Thomas returned the opening kickoff 86 yards for a touchdown. Junior receiver Pat Donahue scored the game-winning touchdown with a 28-yard reception in the third quarter.
