# QB made his mark quietly

In the year of the quarterback in Delaware County, Chester's Charles Cole, the preseason sleeper of the bunch, proved to open the most eyes. With most of the area's quarterback hype going to Matt Blundin of Ridley and Kenny Hull of Strath Haven, Cole, a quiet sort, laid low and merely had the best year of anyone.

Cole, a 6-foot-3, 195-pound senior, was the most dominant player in District 1. He threw for 1,488 yards and 18 touchdowns and completed better than 50 percent of his passes in leading the Clippers to a 10-1 record and their first unshared Del-Val League championship since 1978.

en everyone was talking about "When everyone was talking about Blundin and Hull. I was saying. Hey, let's not rule this kid out," said Chester coach Joe Carroll. "I knot Charles' makeup. He never showed it, but inwardly, I knew he was deter-mined to have his best season ever. And he did."

In a season that was interrupted twice by a teachers' strike, Cole maintained a standard of excellence. He saved his best for last. In Chester's biggest game of the season, the title-clincher at Interboro in November, Cole threw for 240 yards and three touchdowns to lead the Clippers to a 36-2 win.

"He would have thrown for 2,000 yards this year if our receivers didn't drop so many," Carroll said. "Our first game against Coatesville, we dropped nine balls, all right on the money. But instead of getting dis-couraged he kept plugging, and we won the game

That was the biggest difference in Charles this year — his maturity. He's a quiet kid, but he turned into a leader on the field. He never missed a practice, and he practiced hard. The rest of the kids picked up on that

The colleges have come flocking. And why not. Cole would fit into most any kind of offense, from the pro-set drop back to the option. Be-sides possessing a rifle arm, Cole runs a 4.6-second 40-yard dash. Because of that speed, several schools have talked to him about converting to defensive back.

His list of college possibilities in-cludes Temple, Penn State, Pitt, Minnesota, North Carolina and Indiana
