Two of the area's top-ranked football teams — No. 2 Pennsbury and No. 3 Neshaminy — suffered setbacks yesterday in area football action.

In the Pennsbury game, Jim Scott hit teammate Brad Yurick with the game-clinching touchdown late in the fourth period as visiting Norristown upset Pennsbury, 20-8, the No. 2 team in Southeastern Pennsylvania according to The Inquirer's coaches poll, in a Suburban One League National Conference game yesterday.

Norristown's win terminated the Falcons' 14 game winning streak.

Norristown's Danny Boyd, The Inquirer's Suburban Athlete of the Week, rushed for 89 yards on 24 carries. He scored from the 12-yard line in the first period to propel the Eagles (30-1 overall, 10 league) to a 7-0 lead in the opening quarter.

A Bob Horton 42-yard interception return with 6 minutes, 40 seconds left in the first half supplied Norristown with a 14-0 lead at the intermission.

Pennsbury (3-1, 0-1) trimmed Norristown's lead to 14-8 when Mike Lyle scored on a 1-yard plunge early in the third quarter. But Scott, who passed for 139 yards on seven completions, hit Yurick with an 81-yard strike with 4:31 remaining to seal the upset.

Abington 18, Neshaminy 13 — In a battle featuring a pair of ranked and undefeated team, Larry Waugh scored three touchdowns — including the game-clincher in the final minute — and paced eighth-ranked Abington to its fifth consecutive triumph.

Waugh, a 6-foot, 190-pound senior, posted scoring runs of 10 and 3 yards in the first period on the way to a total of 119 yards rushing for the game.

Neshaminy assumed a 13-12 lead in the final period on touchdowns by Jim Dougherty and Tom Knox.

Waugh sealed the upset by Abington with a 3-yards scoring sprint with just 49 seconds remaining in the game.

Marshall Roberts, Waugh and Joel Trotter paced the Ghosts' defense, which halted a four-game Neshaminy winning streak.
