

Stroudsburg Lands Most All-Stars; Neshaminy Ace Heads Big 7 Voting

Champs Place 12 On Teams

Stroudsburg dominates the all-Lehigh Valley League football team for 1971 as might be expected.

The Mountaineers, who swept to their first league championship unbeaten, gained 12 places on the first team — five on offense and seven on defense.

All eight league coaches participated in a roundtable voting session. The selections were announced yesterday by Elwood Rehgrig of Lehigh, league president.

This year's team featured two unanimous choices; five repeaters from last year and a senior and a couple of juniors on both the offensive and defensive units.

All-state halfback Art Owens of Stroudsburg, who set state scoring records this fall, received the vote of every coach. Teammate and quarterback Al McCormick was the other unanimous first team choice.

Fullback Dave Reiss of Northampton and Owens repeated on the offensive team, while Eric Butler of Northampton and Rich Hopstock of Lehigh, another all-state selection this season, were named to the defensive team for the second straight year.

Butler is only a junior and he joins Stroudsburg's Bill Brown on both offense and defense. The 6-2, 250-pound Brown made both teams at tackle, while Butler was named to the first team on offense as an end and to the first team on defense as a linebacker.

Rich Kulp and Len Cowitch, classmates and teammates of Butler, also made the first team, offensively. The only other junior cited on the first team offense was Terry Ganey, a guard from Emmaus.

Brown, Butler and Randy Rizzetto of Emmaus and Don Clemens of Northampton were the only junior selections on the defensive team.

A three-way tie resulted in the balloting for offensive center. Larry Armbruster of Lehigh, Gerry Smith of Stroudsburg and George Cocea of Whitehall tied for the spot. There was a two-way tie between Carl Upshulte of Stroudsburg and Lehigh's George Barkanic as the third linebacker. Barkanic won a spot on the team a year ago as a defensive tackle.

Five boys finished in a tie for the third halfback position on defense.

The only other tie was at offensive end. Kevin Seltzer of Lehigh tied Butler for the spot. The other choice was Stroudsburg's Lou Silver, who also made the defensive team as a halfback. Lehigh placed a third boy on first team offense in the person of halfback Dave Snyder.

The first team defensive ends selected were David Yost of Northampton and Bob Jennings of Stroudsburg. Dan Sommers was another of Stroudsburg's champions cited. He was picked as the defensive tackle opposite Bill Brown.

James Eichelberger of Cataqua gained the defensive guard spot with Bruce Lorrach of Slatington and Rizzetto with Doug Brown, the heralded Stroudsburg linebacker, and Butler were solid choices as linebackers.

Besides Hopstock, the first team defensive halfbacks included Darryl Roberts and five others who tied for the final berth. They were Wayne Kern of Slatington, Mark Adams of Stroudsburg, Eric Gerencser of Cataqua, Don Clemens of Northampton and Silver.

Emmaus Swimmers Win 3rd Straight

Charlie Norelli anchored a record-setting 400-yard freestyle relay team in the final event of the meet last night as Emmaus defeated Wilson of West Lawn for the first time ever 54-41 for its third straight swimming victory of the campaign.

Emmaus had a 47-41 lead going into the event, and Wilson could have won the meet with a victory in the relay. But the Emmaus team of Jim Ritter, Chip Hammersmith, Dave Reichard and Norelli never gave the visitors a chance while winning in 3 minutes, 28 seconds to break the old school and pool records of 3:28.8 set in 1968.

Hammersmith took firsts in the 200 and 100-yard freestyle races, and Norelli won the 50-yard freestyle and anchored the winning medley relay team for the Green Hornets, Wilson,

coached by former AHS star Roy Snyder, had one double winner — Wayne Gratz captured the 200-yard individual medley and the 100-yard butterfly races.

Wilson won a jayvee meet 41-40.

Bruce McHale, Neshaminy's 195-pound senior who has been shifted from spot to spot during his career with the Redskins was named to the Big Seven Conference All-Star team for the third straight year yesterday during a league meeting at Liberty.

McHale had been selected at offensive center in his sophomore and junior years, but this year, he moved to offensive end and gained a spot on the first team at that position. He was also picked as a first-team linebacker, making him the only player to make the first team on both units.

Neshaminy, which rolled through its entire season without a loss, took nine spots on the first team — six on offense and three on defense. Pennsburg followed with five first-team spots, while Easton grabbed four spots, Dieruff two and Allen and Freedom one apiece.

Pete Cordelli, who directed Neshaminy's high-powered offensive attack, was picked at the quarterback spot, and one of the running back positions went to his teammate, Bruce Traney, who was the leading scorer in the conference. The other two running backs are Dieruff's Mike Zambelli, who scored 10 touchdowns — five in the finale against Allen — and booted 10 extra points; and Allen's Mike Squires, who scored eight TDs for the year.

Chuck Lodge, who took the center spot at Neshaminy when McHale was moved to end and went on to make first team all-state at the position, was named the first-team conference center and also received honorable mention as a linebacker. Dale Forchetti of the Redskins was selected as a first-team offensive end and received honorable mention as a defensive back.
