



# Neshaminy Triumphs, 34-16; Cordelli Throws for 2 TDs

Neshaminy played its best game of the year Friday night to defeat Easton, 34-16, before 13,000 fans at Neshaminy but for quarterback Pete Cordelli the performance wasn't good enough.

"I'm still making too many mental mistakes," the Redskins' quarterback said. "I was lucky tonight but we're going to be facing some good teams in the next few weeks and I can't afford to play the way I did."

All Cordelli did was throw a 69-yard touchdown pass to Dale Forchetti on the third Neshaminy play of the game. Early in the second quarter he again hit Forchetti with a TD pass, this one for 37 yards.

Late in the fourth quarter Cordelli threw a long pass to Rich McIntyre, which set up the final Neshaminy touchdown. McIntyre took it in from the one-yard line.

"Easton was quick but we were pretty quick tonight ourselves," Cordelli said. "Forchetti is just amazing. He's the kind of athlete that comes along once every 25 years.

"It was our best performance of the year, everyone

played well, but I've got to stop making mistakes. I think we're the best team around . . . otherwise I wouldn't be playing."

Pete Schupakus scored for Neshaminy in the third quarter on a 37-yard off-tackle run. He cut over the right side, went wide and outran the Easton defenders to the goal line. Bruce Tranev added another Neshaminy touchdown in the fourth quarter on a two-yard run, capping a 58-yard drive.

Bryan Kelly scored the only Easton TD of the second half when he took a 48-yard pass from quarterback Mike Miller.

In the second quarter Easton mounted a drive but was stopped at the Neshaminy 11. The Redskins took over but were forced to punt when Cordelli was caught on a third-down play and barely managed to escape the end zone.

The punt was returned to the Neshaminy 22-yard line and three plays later Bob Schooley scored on a nine-yard run.
