# Neshaminy Finishes No. 1, Outlasts Pennsbury, 21-17

Neshaminy's 1959 defensive unit established a Lower Bucks record for fewest touchdowns in one season. That record, in jeopardy until Saturday, still stands.

A stung Pennsbury defense had allowed only 4.4 points per game going into Saturday's contest with unbeaten Neshaminy. The Redskins needed nine points to maintain their 1959 record.

The game ended 21-17 in favor of Neshaminy, but the closeness of the contest kept the home fans shouting "We're No. 1" until the final 30 seconds.

Neshaminy had entered the match as The Inquirer's top-ranked team, while Pennsbury

was rated No. 2. Both teams lived up to their advanced billing.

Much of Neshaminy's pregame thoughts were in cracking the Pennsbury defense. Chuck Lodge, Neshaminy's offensive center and defensive linebacker, usually plays his

### Tennet Topples To Council Rock

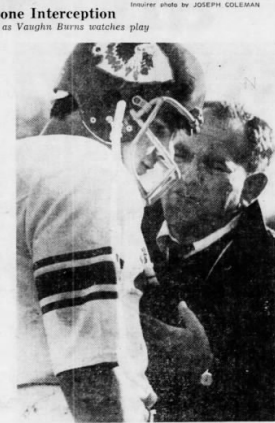
