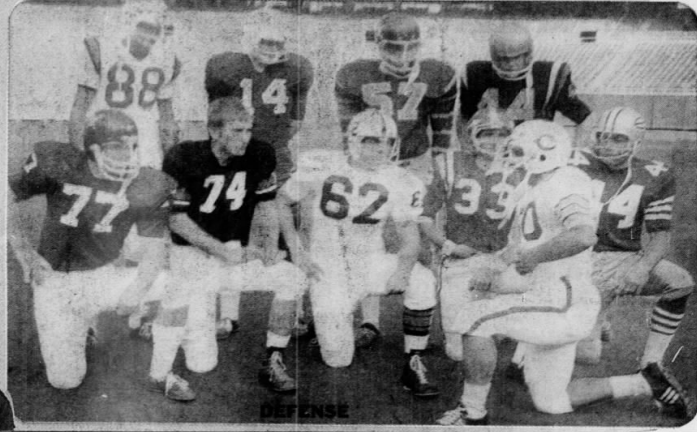

Neshaminy, Central Top on 1st Team

Ken Anderson, Central's outstanding running back, has scored nine touchdowns in eight games this season and like several players on all-Area football team excels in two sports.

Anderson also runs the 100-yard dash and anchors the 6-mile relay team for coach Ed Veith's track squad. Two of Anderson's teammates at Central — Warren McAllister and Greg Pittman — join him on the All-Area squad.

"Pittman is the one that has been opening the holes for Kenny all season," Veith said. McAllister is a linebacker on The Inquirer team and also plays fullback for the Central offense. He has provided the key plays that have helped the leaders compile a 10-0 record in Public League play this year.

Neshaminy High, which finished the season 10-0 and was ranked No. 1 in the Delaware Valley, also placed three men on the All-Area team. Quarterback Pete Cordelli threw 24 touchdowns pass this season to break the Roddin's season record.

One of Cordelli's targets was tight end Bruce McHale, about whom Coach Jack Swartz says, "His blocking is the

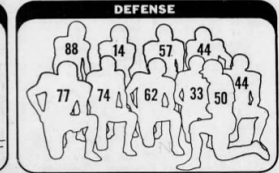
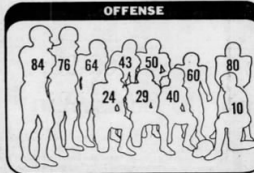
Haverford School placed two players on the All-Area team with running back John Haldeman and linebacker Tom Hipple. "Hipple is the best linebacker I've seen in this
