

Cordelli's TD bomb caps South practice

The South All-Stars ended their last full practice last night at Langborne's Neshaminy High School with a touchdown, a long pass from Neshaminy's Pete Cordelli to Dale Forchett.

The next time Cordelli and Forchett connect for a score probably will be tomorrow night when the North meets the South in the first Bucks County Cancer Society High School All-Star football game at 8 p.m. at Nesbammy.

The South's vaunted aerial attack has been the primary concern of North coach Mike Pettine throughout his team's drills at Central Bucks West in Doylestown.

"We have to stop the bomb," Pettine said. "We can't let them beat us long."

South Should Win

But the South will be running against a North defense that is expected to be one of the best in the state.

If the South receivers are blanketed on long passes, Cordelli will throw for short gains. And to complement the passing, the South has a thundering backfield of Neshaminy's Pete Schupakus and Bruce Tranev and Wilson's Sam Caucci who averages almost 200 pounds and should be able to run through, if not around, the North defense.

The North offensive backs are probably quicker overall than the South's Central Bucks West's Tom Duff, Dan Guydon and Ray Gioamer and Tennenige; Juventus all are swift and strong.

But the South will be running against a North defense that is expected to be one of the best in the state.

The effectiveness of the North defensive line, meanwhile, is admitted by Pettine to be uncertain. Cooncil Rock's Dick Bedesem will be starting at quarterback for the North. He is a running option, but he will be facing a defense filled with players who have seen him before. Seven of the South's defensive starters are from Neshaminy and Pennsbury.
