



## Neshaminy 20, Norristown 19

EAST NORRITON, Pa. — Tom Waterbor's foot proved the difference as the Redskins won a big Suburban One National game.

Neshaminy is now 6-2 overall, 5-0 in SON play for 10 points. Pennsbury, The Times' No. 1 team, is 7-0 and 4-0 in SON going into today's game at Wm. Tennent.

Waterbor kicked extra points after touchdown runs by Tim Ford and Joe Dougherty. But it was his two field goals, 27 and 35 yarders, that were the margin of difference.

Norristown scored a late touchdown and went for a two-point conversion that would have won the game, but the pass was broken up.

Neshaminy 20, Norristown 19 — Tommy Waterbor converted a pair of field goals — including a decisive 35-yard effort — and helped the Redskins outlast Norristown.

Neshaminy, which managed just 183 total yards, used scores by Tim Ford and Jim Dougherty, along with Waterbor's field goals and built a 20-7 advantage in the third period.

Norristown, which piled up 318 yards of offense, was sparked by quarterback Frank Cassano, who completed 6 of 14 passes for 130 yards.
