## Katona doing heavy lifting for Neshaminy

It's no wonder Neshaminy's Ryan Katona is an all-eyes-on-him performer in the weight

Katona, a beefy senior line Katona, a beety senior line-man, has closely watched and worked out with his grandfa-ther, Robert DeRisi, a former national and world powerlift-

ing champion.

"When I was younger, I
went to a lot of his competitions," Katona said. "It's some-thing I'd like to get into one

For now, Katona is usy being a two-vay stalwart for the way stalwart for the Redskins, who ad-vanced to the PIAA District 1 Class AAAA championship with Friday's 33-7 emifinal romp over West Chester Rustin at Harry E. Franks Stadium in Langhorne.

The 5-foot-10, 298-pound Ka-ona, who fills out all of his No. 73 jersey, has been a fixure at offensive and defensive tackle. Last year, he con-centrated on defense.

"It's been different playing both ways this year," the 18-year-old said. "It's definitey harder. But I enjoy it, think ve handled the demands of pretty well. I like being olved as much as possible.

On Friday at 7:30 p.m. at Council Rock North's Walt Snyder Stadium, Neshaminy, he No. 4 seed, will clash with No. 3-seed North Penn for the district crown. The Knights reached the final with a 28-14 victory Friday over No. 2 ed Council Rock South.

Katona, a first-team all-Sub rban One League National

fense, has notched 29 tackles in 13 games for a defense that limited the Golden Knights wing-T offense to 175 total yards and 10 first downs.

"We just executed our game plan, did a good job of shut-ting down the run," Katona said. "We've gotten better as a group as the season has gone along. We've figured out our strengths and weakness-es and made adjustments

where needed. Katona, of Levit-town, began play-ing football in seventh grade at Carl Sandburg Middle School. He has bench-pressed 335

pounds, squatted 640, and power-cleaned 275. "He's a strong kid, has very good footwork for someone his size, and he's got experience," Red-skins coach Mark Schmidt

said. "Sometimes, on defense he takes up two players, and that frees up our other guys to make plays."

Neshaminy's defensive line also features tackle Brandon Martynuik, and ends Shane Quinn and Kiser Terry. The Command And Marker lerry. The linebacking corps is made up Corey Majors, Tyler Master-son, Devin Carmichael, and Denny Lord. Dwight Will-iams, Bobby Marterella, and Dylan Donnelly are the backs.

the Knights. "We're excited about the

chance to play for the district championship," said Katona, who is thinking of majoring in secondary education in college and becoming a history teacher. "We look forward to getting after it, giving it the best we've got.
