

Souderton tips Neshaminy on failed PAT try

Souderton managed to thwart a Neshaminy drive in the last five minutes and hung on for 14-13 win in the first meeting ever between the Suburban One League rivals last night at Souderton.

Souderton's Derek Brown scored two touchdowns in a game that was decided when the Redskins failed to convert after their second touchdown, missing a chance to tie the score at 14-14.

"They're an established program, and we had something to prove," Souderton coach Ed Gallagher said.

The Redskins got the ball in the closing minutes. But after marching from their own 13 to the Souderton 39, the Indians' defense stiffened, and

they took over on downs.

Brown got his first touchdown on a 43-yard run on the team's first play from scrimmage after Neshaminy was forced to punt. Brown, a 5-foot-11, 184-pound junior, broke to the outside and outran Neshaminy defenders down his right sideline at 5 minutes, 25 seconds of the second quarter.

His second touchdown came less than two minutes later after sophomore Clint Passarella recovered a Neshaminy fumble at the Redskins 15 and took the ball to the Neshaminy 5.

Neshaminy scored when Quilan Arnold went in from 8 yards out just before half-time. A pass from Brian Titus to Rick Brebner accounted for Neshaminy's second

touchdown early in the third quarter, but Seth Jeffries' extra-point try was wide.
