# Prep duo proves strong up front

**Mark Arcidiacono, lineman, St. Joseph's Prep.** A powerful blocker and stellar pass protector, the Penn State recruit recorded 81 knockdown blocks at right tackle. He was a first-team all-Catholic League selection.

**Seth Betancourt, lineman, St. Joseph's Prep.** At tackle, the imposing second-year starter anchored the left side of the line. Betancourt is receiving Division I recruiting interest from top-flight programs around the country.

**Adam Citko, lineman, Archbishop Wood.** With his aggressive run blocker, the Temple recruit helped the Vikings average 32.1 points per game and advance to the PIAA Class AAA state championship game.

**Brandon Heath, lineman, West Chester Henderson.** A terrific run blocker, Heath was the force behind the Warriors' triple-option attack. In-

terest has come from Akron, Delaware, Hofstra and Villanova.

**David Osel, lineman, Abington.** This Rutgers recruit, a standout pass blocker with good feet and agility, is a big reason the Ghosts went 10-3, passed for 2,400 yards, and averaged 31 points a game.

**Curtis Drake, quarterback, West Catholic.** The Inquirer's Southeastern Pennsylvania player of the year beat foes with his legs and arm. The Penn State recruit rushed for 1,639 yards and 21 touchdowns. He passed for 1,354 yards and 15 TDs.

**Rob Hollomon, running back, West Catholic.** Overcoming a slight build, Hollomon used his quickness, vision and open-field moves to terrorize defenses. He carried 150 times for 1,923 yards and 36 TDs.

**Tim Keyser, running back, Gar-**

**net Valley.** Keyser was an electrifying multipurpose player for the Jaguars. He rushed for 1,099 yards and 16 TDs on 100 carries. As a receiver, he had 25 catches for 353 yards and two scores.

**Bernard Pierce, running back, Glen Mills.** Strong and quick, Pierce carried 149 times for 1,578 yards and 24 TDs to lead the Bulls to a share of the Del-Va League title. He has orally committed to Temple.

**Rondell White, running back, Bayard Rustin.** In leading the Golden Knights to a District 1 Class AAA championship, the fleet-footed White carried 294 times for 2,113 yards and 32 TDs. He returned three kickoffs for scores.

**Paul Carrezola, tight end, Neshaminy.** The Rutgers recruit excelled as a blocker and receiver while helping spark the Redskins to a 12-2 record and the Suburban One League National Conference championship.

**Sam Felecia, wide receiver, La Salle.** With smarts and exceptional hands, Felecia, a first-team all-Catholic pick and the top target for QB Drew Loughery, caught 51 passes for 969 yards and eight TDs.

**Joe Price, wide receiver, Malvern Prep.** Price's knack for the clutch catch and precision route-running was key in the Friars' drive to the Inter-AC League title. He had 36 receptions for 939 yards and 13 TDs.

**Ronnie Akins, all-purpose, North Penn.** The speedster was a do-everything player: A Division I-A recruit, he excelled as a running back (1,023 yards), receiver, cornerback and kick returner. He had 33 total TDs.

**Je'Ron Stokes, all-purpose, Northeast.** His abilities as a quick-footed wideout, kick returner and defensive back were critical for the Vikings. The Tennessee-bound Stokes caught 45 passes for 555 yards and five scores.

**Brandon McManus, kicker, North Penn.** The Temple recruit hit six field goals, with a long of 47 yards, and converted 65 of 66 point-after tries. Seventy percent of his kickoffs were touchbacks. He averaged nearly 41 yards per punt.

# 2 apiece for Malvern Prep, Judge

**Josh Coulter, lineman, Downingtown West.** Once hesitant about even playing the sport, Coulter has become quite the force. With a nonstop motor, the end and middle guard racked up 31 sacks in 13 games.

**Kadeem Custis, lineman, Neumann-Goretti.** A strong pass-rushing end for the Saints, Custis, a first-team all-Catholic League Division AAA pick, will join Bernard Pierce and several other locals at Temple.

**CJ Mooney, lineman, Malvern Prep.** With the hard-working Mooney positioned at end, the Friars allowed only 11.5 points per game and notched four shutouts. He also contributed as a blocking tight end.

**Cody Muller, lineman, Souder-ton.** An end who was hard to keep away from the quarterback, Muller finished with 32 career sacks. He is hearing from the likes of New Hampshire, Villanova, Richmond and Monmouth.

**Dan Shirey, lineman, Neshaminy.** He starred as a two-way tackle for the Redskins. His interior toughness has drawn interest from Massachusetts, Maine, Hofstra and New Hampshire, among others.

**Sean Cunningham, linebacker, Archbishop Wood.** His play on both sides of the ball was impressive. Cunningham posted nearly 130 tackles. He rushed for a single-season school record of 1,783 yards and 26 touchdowns.

**Adam Nowak, linebacker, Father Judge.** Nearly making the switch from strong safety to outside linebacker, he was a solid playmaker and lights-out hitter. Nowak also chipped in as a receiver, long snapper and backup QB.

**John Nuthen, linebacker, Great Valley.** An intense competitor, Nuthen registered 141 tackles, including 11 for losses, and two interceptions. He ended his career with 347 tackles, 13 sacks and four interceptions.

**Andrew Stoll, linebacker, North Penn.** The captain was

involved in a team-high 85 tackles, including 61 solos and four sacks. Stoll earned first-team all-Suburban One League Continental Conference honors.

**Billy Conners, back, Malvern Prep.** In addition to being a top-notch thrower, with 1,509 passing yards and 19 TDs, Conners was quite the cornerback. He had five INTs, including two against St. Joseph's Prep.

**Mike Doty, back, Central Bucks South.** A smart player with strong tackling skills, Doty was the Titans' most valuable player. As a receiver, he snagged 52 passes for 1,084 yards and 14 TDs.

**Tom Ryan, back, Father Judge.** Like teammate and fellow first-teamer Nowak, Ryan did a little bit of everything for the Crusaders. The Towson recruit contributed as a

ball-hawking free safety, wideout and punt returner.

**Abdul Smith, back, Perkiomen School.** A safety bound for Rutgers, Smith is an excellent one-on-one defender, solid against the run, and has the speed to cover the entire field. He had five interceptions in eight games.

**Mike Yeager, back, St. Joseph's Prep.** Yeager, a Division I-AA prospect, is quick and deceptively strong. At safety, he delivered plenty of jarring hits. He also rushed for more than 1,300 yards and 13 TDs.

**Will McFillin, punter, George Washington.** His punting ability often left an opening of defense with a long field to traverse. Also a quality placekicker, he had two field goals in a 6-3 win over Frankford.
