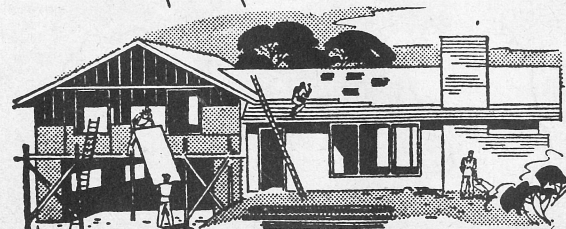

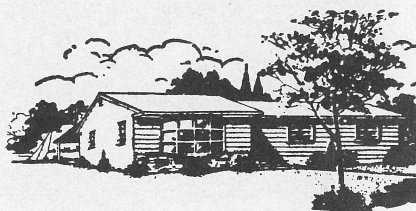

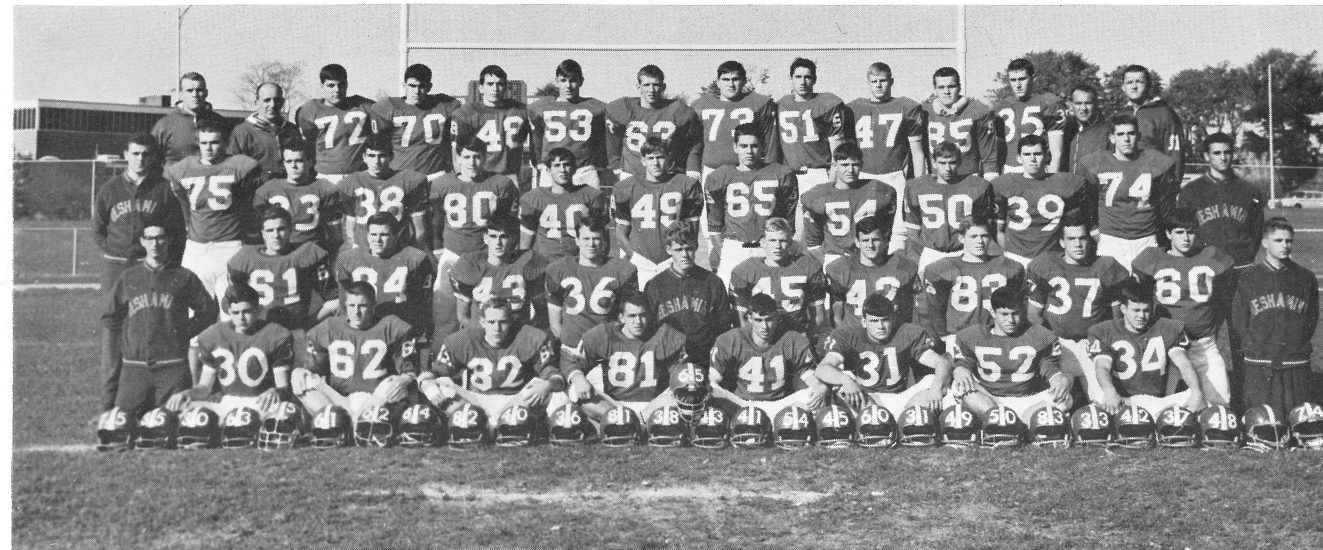

REDSKIN REVIEW NO. 9

ALTOONA SCALPED 27-6. Neshaminy High's Redskins counted coup on the Mountain Lions from Altoona last Saturday in one of Neshaminy's finest football hours. The ambush was initiated by Harry Hoffman who recovered an Altoona fumble on the kick-off, and six plays later Colbert was in the end zone. Nolte added the extra point - Neshaminy 7 - Altoona 0. But the Mountain Lions came right back and sustained a 74 yard march to score their lone T.D. on a pass from QB Beatty to Fresca. Score 7-6. Altoona threatened again in the second quarter but the Redskin Savages held on the four yard line.

With 1:49 left in the first half, Barr intercepted an Altoona pass at midfield and returned it to the visitor's 13. In two plays Jimmy Colbert scored his second T.D. on a roll-out, making the halftime score 14-6, as Nolte split the uprights.

NESHAMINY'S SECOND HALF SCORING came as a result of a 53 yard drive following the second half kick off. On the fourth down Colbert took it in from one foot out. Score 20-6. The Redskins final T.D. came on a perfect play as Barr shot through the right side and cut back to go 35 yards to pay dirt. Nolte concluded the games' scoring with his third conversion. **FINAL SCORE 27-6.**

AND NOW - LET'S WELCOME PENNSBURY

The Falcons, coached by Erle Baugher, have an impressive 6-1-1 record. Their only loss coming at the hands of Altoona. Their lone tie occurred last week as Pennsbury hosted Wilson. Tonight's contest is a must for both teams - a Pennsbury victory would guarantee the Falcons at least a tie in Section One of the Lower Bucks League, while a Neshaminy victory would move the Redskins one scalp closer to the trophy. 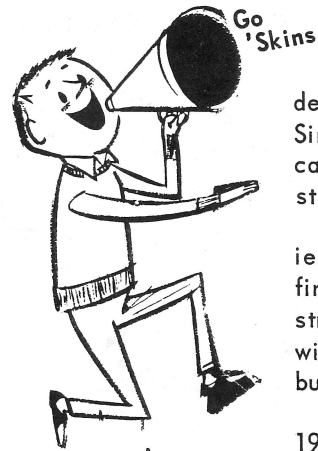

Redskin Streak At Stake . . . 49 Without A Loss



A football team representing Neshaminy High last suffered a defeat on September 22, 1961 when Easton turned the trick, 13-7. Since then, in a period extending through the balance of the 1961 campaign (nine games, the Redskin grid teams have posted a streak of 45 wins and four ties.

That 1961 Easton-Neshaminy game was third in the young series, and the Redskins had never beaten the upstate team. In their first clash (1959), Easton also won, 13-7, and stopped a 17-0-1 string, and in 1960 the teams battled to a tie. The '61 Red Rover win snapped a 13-game unbeaten streak the Neshaminy team had built.

Neshaminy finally gained revenge over the Easton team in 1962 with a 13-6 triumph, won by a 14-9 margin in '63, by 19-0 last year and this season rallied in the last quarter for a 33-27 triumph.

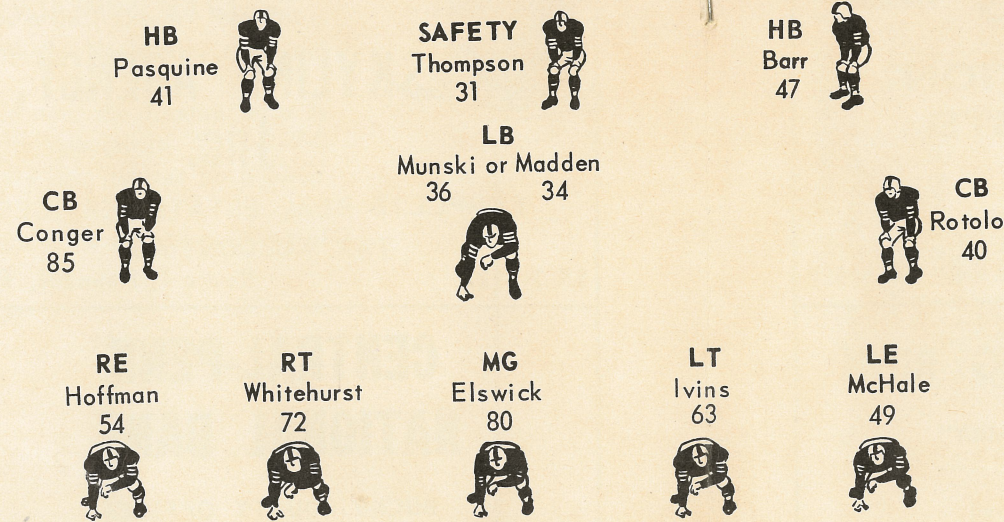

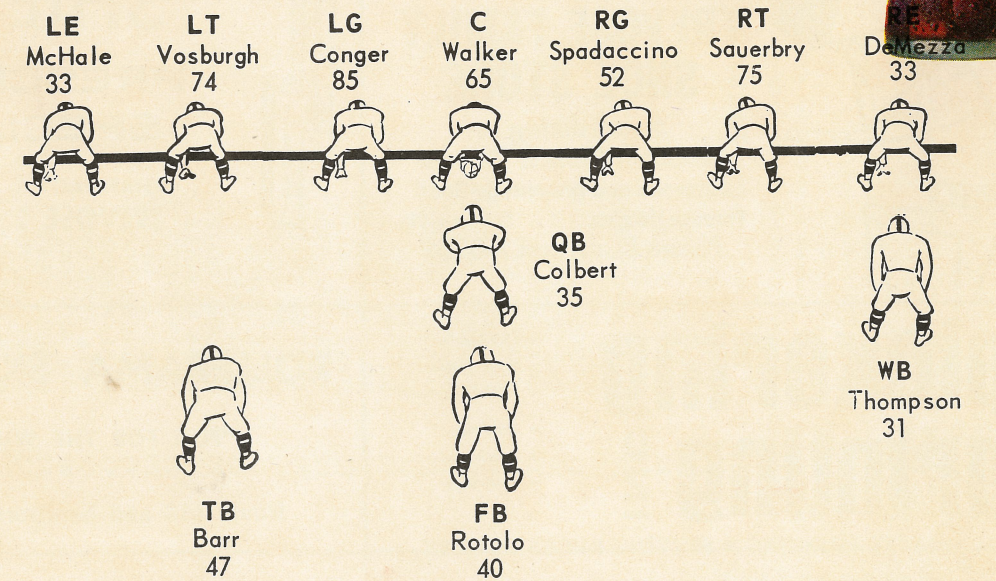

Probable Starting Line-Up - Defense

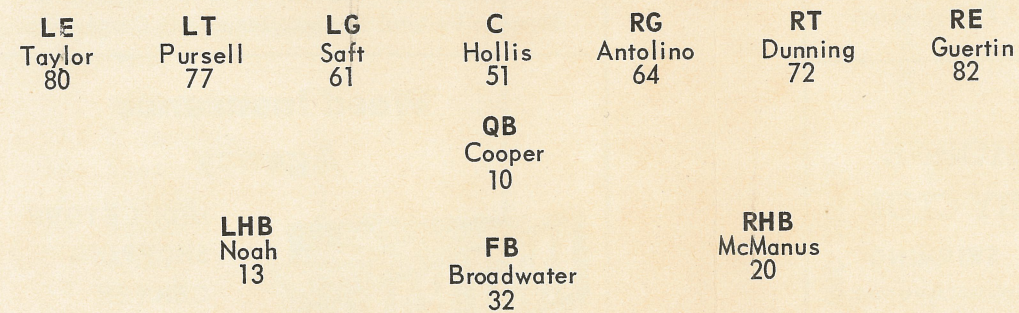


Probable Starting Line-Up - Offense
