

# Bailie's three touchdowns power Redskins over the Eagles, 35-13

**NESHAMINY** from BC1 uncertain.

Junior Greg Treude and senior Jesse Carpenter took turns replacing Kelly.

"It's hard to work out of a hole like that against a good team," said Carpenter, who scored twice in the fourth quarter on a pair of bullish runs.

He also unleashed a 40-yard aerial bomb that teammate Mark Baehser hauled in at the Neshaminy 16 to set up one of his scores.

"With these [fullback-size] shoulder pads, I had to turn my body sideways and heave it like a grenade," Carpenter said. "It surprised

me that it worked."

Neshaminy's ground game operated so smoothly that Mormello's passing skills weren't often needed. One of the area's top returning throwers, Mormello looked sharp on some plays, but often forced some passes. He completed 5 of 9 for 73 yards, with two interceptions.

"We're happy with him for the most part," Bedesem said. "But he's such a perfectionist that he thinks he should complete every pass. On the one interception, he made the mortal sin of putting a lot of air under it because he didn't want a sack. But we talked to him about that."

Neshaminy's defense held Conwell-Egan to one first-half first down and just seven for the game. Linebacker Steve Derry, who also rushed for 35 yards and one touchdown, intercepted two passes.

Eagle defensive back Phil Shipos came up with all three of his team's turnovers. He had two interceptions and a fumble recovery.
