## Delaware Valley College Hall of Fame shines its spotlight

Warminster's **Eric Reynolds** was among the recent inductees into Delaware Valley College's Hall of Fame.

Reynolds, in Warminster's Class of '83, is the second-leading all-time rusher in Delaware Valley College football history, having gained 2,311 yards in four years. He helped lead Del Val to three consecutive Middle Atlantic Conference championships between 1980 and 1982. (Jim Wilson, 1984-87, is the Aggies' all-time leading rusher with 2,634 yards.)

You might remember Reynolds as the guy who set the school's all-time rushing record in 1980 against Albright with 254 yards. The three-time MAC all-star finished that season with 1,002 yards rushing, the first Aggie to break the 1,000-yard barrier.

Perhaps Reynolds' biggest feat was that he

fumbled only four times in his career, a rarity among running backs who carry the ball 20 times or more a game. Reynolds went a record 207 consecutive carries without a fumble during one point in his career.

"Excluding the birth of my children, this is the happiest day of my life," Reynolds said at his election to the Hall of Fame.

### Football notes

■ It didn't take former Neshaminy High soccer star **Matt Bahr** long to feel at home with the Eagles. Bahr kicked field goals of 42 and 27 yards during the Birds' 34-31 win over the Washington Redskins on Sept. 19.

Bahr was signed Sept. 16 as an insurance policy because kicker Roger Ruzek had a strained right hamstring. Bahr had been cut by the New York Giants despite hitting 19 of 25 field goals last season.

On Friday, the Eagles decided to keep Bahr,

and let Ruzek go.

Bahr, 37, is a 14-year NFL veteran, having played for the Steelers, 49ers, Browns and Giants. Lifetime, Bahr has made 239 of 332 field goals.

■ Neshaminy High recently inducted seven former athletes into its football Hall of Fame. Those honored were fullback **Armand Fizzane** (1947-48), running back **Tom Stricker** (1954-57), quarterback **Rich Simon** (1956-58), defensive end **Ed Fiorelli** (1957-59), defensive back **Bob Barr** (1960-62), center **Bill Walker** (1963-65), and two-way end **Les Shoda** (1976-79).

Also honored for 13 years of distinguished service in preparing Neshaminy's athletic fields was Fairless Hills resident **Donald Sichel**.

■ Yardley's **James Blocker-Bodley**, who graduated from Pennsbury High, is the backup tailback at William and Mary.

A senior, Blocker-Bodley rushed for 8 yards

on one carry during the Tribe's 42-35 loss at Delaware on Sept. 11. Last season, he spent much of his time on special teams.

Blocker-Bodley is among the Tribe's strongest players. He can bench-press 360 pounds and squat 430.

He played for **Jim Dundala** and **Al Matuza Jr.** in high school.

■ Katztown senior kicker **Dean Myers**, from Quakertown High, booted a 44-yard field goal and punted seven times for a 32.3-yard average during the Golden Bears' 54-9 season-opening loss to nationally ranked Indiana Sept. 6.

Myers sat out last season.

■ **Marc Donohoe**, a junior business major at Rider College, is beginning his second season on the Broncos' soccer team.

Donohoe is a graduate of Holy Ghost Prep.

He was voted most improved player on the team a year ago. Donohoe played fullback and started 19 games as a redshirt freshman in 1992.

■ Senior **Chris Cassidy**, from William Tennent, returns to the striker position on Lock Haven's men's soccer team.

Cassidy earned all-Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference honors last season after scoring 10 goals and adding four assists for the Bald Eagles.

Cassidy is among the school's all-time leading scorers with 23 career goals. Other returning lettermen on the squad include senior mid-fielder **Trevor Warner** (Truman), who was all-PSAC in 1991. Also at midfield is **Ryan Caep** (Truman), a two-time school MVP, and **Joe Trymbiski** (C.B. West), a junior, who has transferred from Delaware Tech Junior College.
