Seven Saturday games highlight the local scholastic football weekend with the remaining pair of contests scheduled to be played Friday evening.

On Friday, Council Rock welcomes Jenkintown in a Lower Bucks County Football League (Section Two) affair and Neshaminy catches Allentown Dieruff reeling from the effects of a 20-0 loss at the hands of Easton Area's Red Rovers. The Redskins still have a shot at the Big Six title.
