

# Neshaminy May Need New Head Grid Coach Again

Neshaminy High School is apparently in line for a new head football coach before the 1967 campaign.

Pete Cordelli, who was named head coach on Jan. 25, 1967, is expected to step down. Cordelli, however, will not leave coaching

and will remain on the staff, it has been learned from reliable sources.

School officials have denied any changes or adjustments with Neshaminy's football staff are in the making. Richard Howard, acting high school principal, said, "Mr. Cordelli is our head football coach. We are not contemplating any changes. I don't believe a discussion at this time would be in the best interests of the school."

## Replaced McHugh

The appointment of Cordelli over three months ago came on the heels of the resignation of Tom McHugh, who was head football coach during the 1966.

The 40-year-old Cordelli, who was a Neshaminy assistant since 1958, filled the vacancy.

Cordelli's decision to step down as the Redskin leader but to remain in coaching is a major surprise, although it does not come in the wake of controversy. The move is for personal

reasons, informed sources relate.

Jack Swartz, who was a Neshaminy assistant from 1955 to 1966, is reported to be a top choice for the slot. Swartz resigned after the '66 season and was out of coaching last campaign, when the 'Skins were 2-6-2. He accepted the assistant's post under Cordelli in January.

Swartz's current position, like Cordelli's, is reported "unchanged."
