

Pennsbury Places 10 Gridders On Section One Team

Pennsbury High School captured the Lower Bucks County Football League (Section One) crown finishing unbeaten in three games and rolling up 123 points to the opposition's 41.

The conference winners also had the distinction of placing the lion's share of all-league performers on the Section One "dream team" which was decided by voting of Section One coaches and sports writers of the Bucks County Courier Times this week.

Erle Baugher's Falcons notched five berths on the offensive squad and placed another quintet on the defensive unit. Pennsbury was responsible for the only two-way performers, naming both Gordon Davies, a 5-10, 205-pounder, the only repeater and Mike Farley, at 6-9½, 170 pounds. Both are seniors.

Panthers Place Three

William Tennent High School's best club ever placed three members on the first offensive unit and another on the defensive club. Neshaminy High School landed five players on the combined clubs while Woodrow Wilson hauled down four spots three on the defensive unit.

Pennsbury came up with Rich Orwig (end), Len Shober (tackle), Davies, Mike Farley (back) and Bill Evans (back) on the offensive powerhouse. Those Falcons which got the job done on defense included Dave Billy (end), Mark Lindenmuth (tackle), Bob Belletiere (linebacker) in addition to Davies and Farley.

Members of Pete Cordelli's eleven who made the first offensive unit were led by Bruce Haynes (tackle) and Bill Daenz (running back).

Redskins who stood out on defensive play included Bill Swenson (end), Nick Fizzano (tackle) and Steve Sroba (halfback), who was the only sophomore to make either unit.

Cottman At QB

The Panthers of William Tennent claimed the quarter-backing spot which went to junior Wayne (Chuck) Cottman while junior end Tom Martin and guard Guy Hurrell nailed down top positions.

Bob Wolfrum, the Panthers' captain was named at a line-backing slot.

Woodrow Wilson contributed the first-string center, 6-0, 196-pound Joe Walsh.

The Golden Rams also had junior tackle Bob Zeffer, linebacker Bill Saren and junior halfback Rich Baker on the first defensive unit.

240-Founders

Haynes and Shober, both weighing in at 240 pounds, are the biggest offensive linemen. They anchor a line which averages 204. The first team backfield averages 175 pounds with junior Bill Evans the heaviest at 200 pounds even.

Defensively, the front five (due to a tie in balloting) defenders average 214 pounds with Lindenmuth and Zefferi showing the way 240 pounds each.

Wolfrum, Belletiere and Saren, the linebackers average 187 while the deep back setup of Farley, Baker and Sroba, hit the scales at 160 pounds.
